EUPHRASIA COUNCIL.

The Council met pursuant to adjournment
on the 3rd day of August, 1883.
Members all present.
Minutes of last session of council read and
confirmed.
The Clerk was ordered to request the
County Treasurer to erase from his books,
arrears of taxes charged in error against E
lot 6, con. 4.
The Reeve, Mr. Boyd and Mr. Ellis were
appointed a committee, to ascertain the as-
sets and liabilities, of the Township for the
current year with a view of the levying of
the rates.
The report of said committee received and
adopted, showing that it will be necessary to
levy a rate of one cent on the dollar to meet
all County and Township liabilities, and By-
law rates exclusive of School Trustee rates.
By-law No. 332, levying the rates was
carried through the different stages and
passed.
Thomas Jordan was appointed collector in
the Easterly 5 concessions at a salary of
\$60.
Joseph Manary was appointed collector in
the Westerly 7 concessions, at a salary of
\$60.
Both collectors to submit the names of
their securities to the Reeve or Deputy Reeve
before next meeting of Council.
The Reeve's orders were issued on the
Treasurer to pay as follows, viz.:
To Wm. Hewgill, Esq., \$4.42, being sur-
plus levied in Union S. S. No. 5 with Colling-
wood in 1881, and not paid before.
To Benjamin Smith, \$1.50, for road work;
Mr. Erskine, \$60 to be expended on 9th line
crossway; Albert Paterson, \$7, for removing
stones from road with stoning machine; P.
Harris, \$2, for repairing road scrapers; Jos.
Howe, \$4, for building culvert on 3th line;
Geo. Graham \$4.80, for plank used repairing
bridge; James Johnston, \$3.80, for plank to
repair bridge on town line, St. Vincent.
William Stewart, \$7.50, for plank to re-
pair bridge on 4th line.
On Motion being made and seconded, the
Council adjourned until Saturday the 6th
day of October next.

from our Exchanges and

The "Queens Hotel," Shelburne, has again
changed hands.
G. R. Middleton, of Dundalk, has resumed
Mercantile business.
Jennings Hotel, Shelburne, has been im-
proved by cut stone steps to the main en-
trance.
W. J. Dennis, of the Crown Hotel, Price-
ville, has purchased the running horse "John
A" for \$210.
The Dundalk school house has been im-
proved, during vacation.
The Canada Methodist's of Shelburne, pur-
pose enlarging their church.
The Dundalk Herald says the band boys
were well treated in Markdale, and added,
the single men wish to come again.
A terrible hail storm passed over Pick-
ering two weeks since, almost completely de-
stroying the crops and stripping the fruit
trees for a distance of two miles wide through
the Tp.
There is a Scotch Thistle in Shelburne
between eight and nine feet high.
A Canada thistle eleven feet in height is
the least of a Huntsville man's garden.
Mr. Hector McQuarrie, of Badgeros, has
disposed of his stock of Merchandise to Mr.
Neil McKinnon who will carry on the busi-
ness.
Proton Agricultural Society have decided
to build an addition of 30 x 40 feet to their
Agricultural Hall this season.
Mr. John Wilson, of Osprey, has sold his
farm, lots 55, 56, 57, and 58 in 3rd con-
cession, N. D. Road, Osprey, to Mr. Samuel, of
Egremont, for \$6,600.
There is a movement on foot in Owen
Sound, towards leaving a large summer Hotel
built.
Mt. Forest Mechanics Institute expired
Toronto, on the 8th.
Hanover Village is positioning the Town-
ship of Brant, for a grant of \$75 to be ex-
pended in improving sidewalks. This is right,
and should be granted.
A large number of new houses are being
erected by farmers in the neighbourhood of
Hanover.
The Methodists of Thornbury, took in \$700
at a garden party in the place last week.
Chancery sitting at Grey on 21st of Sep-
tember, and assigns a Nov. 5th before M.
Justice
