**DISASTROUS FIRE.**

**MEAFORD, Sept. 7.**—Another disa-  
strous fire has occurred in Meaford.  
This morning about 8:30 fire was  
discovered issuing from the roof of a  
woodshed adjoining the steam flouring  
and grist-mill of Messrs. Kerr & Cook  
The alarm was at once raised but as  
the flames spread with fearful rapidity  
the splendid mill soon became enve-  
loped in the flames. The mill, which  
was built on town property in 1869,  
was a magnificent structure of its kind.  
It was three storeys in height, 40 by 80  
feet, and contained four run of stones,  
besides combined stone and roller pro-  
cess apparatus. The mill has been  
working day and night, and when at  
twelve o'clock last night the head  
miller and engineer left, everything  
was all right. The contents of the  
mill were all destroyed, and consisted  
of 250 barrels of flour, which was to  
have been shipped to-day, from 1,500  
to 2,000 bushels of wheat, 500 bushels  
of oats, and 15 tons of bran. Messrs.  
Kerr & Cook's loss is \$12,000, and  
there is insurance on the building and  
stock amounting to \$7,000. At six  
o'clock the mill was a pile of ashes.

may not be held on the same day.

On Thursday evening last, Mr. Mc-  
Cullough, sr. went out to the woods  
for the cows. He did not return at  
dark and his friends rightly conjectured  
that he was lost. The alarm was  
given and the villagers turned out in  
full force with lanterns, etc. He was  
found about eleven o'clock that night.  
As he was advanced in years, a night  
in the woods might have resulted  
seriously.
