The Methodist Conference.

Belleville, Sep 18—An unsuccessful attempt was made to-day toextend the limit of a minister's stay in a circuit from three to four or five years. No minister can return to a circuit after less than six years absence. A resolution was adopted to make circulating of methodist literature by ministers obligatory. The conference special comittee is to make the needful ar rangements for the celebration of the centenary of the establishment of methodism in America. It was resolved that each annual conference shall have a contingent fund of its own to relieve cases of special affliction and assist poor circuits. A long conversation ensued on the subject of ministers being connected with trading companies or boards for the investment of funds, which ended in a resolution being adopted prohibiting all ministers being so employed. The temperance report adopted, recommends every encouragement to temperance organizations.
