**BRIDGE REPAIRING.**—A number of  
men were repairing the railway bridge  
close to town, last week, by driving in  
piles of additional support. The re-  
pairs were made none too soon, as the  
abutments, the filling up of which was  
done by contract were filled with dirt  
at the bottom instead of stone; and the  
span being too great the bridge also  
sagged in the middle.—Chronicle.

**The Methodist Conference.**  
Belleville, Sep 18—An unsuccessful  
attempt was made to-day to extend the  
limit of a minister's stay in a circuit  
from three to four or five years. No  
minister can return to a circuit after  
less than six years absence. A resolu-  
tion was adopted to make circulating  
of methodist literature by ministers  
obligatory. The conference special  
committee is to make the needful ar-  
rangements for the celebration of the  
centenary of the establishment of  
methodism in America. It was re-  
solved that each annual conference  
shall have a contingent fund of its own  
to relieve cases of special affliction and  
assist poor circuits. A long conver-  
sation ensued on the subject of minist-  
ers being connected with trading com-  
panies or boards for the investment of  
funds, which ended in a resolution  
being adopted prohibiting all ministers  
being so employed. The temperance  
report adopted, recommends every  
encouragement to temperance organi-  
zations.
