District Dashés.

Fire.—F. L. Brigg's Wdo. mill in Stayer was burned on Saturday last, loss about \$6,000, no insurance. **Plants.** Hotel, outbuildings, and stables at Ross, Muskoka, were destroyed by fire on Saturday morning last, nothing was saved.

The following circular has been issued to trainmen on the C. P. R.: "In future the use of all intoxicating liquors, either on or off duty, is strictly prohibited. Any violation of this order shall be severely dealt with."

An order has been issued regulating the traffic on the C. P. R. which prohibits the taking of any kind of a parcel into the passenger coaches, even a lunch basket being taboed. There is no injunction restraining the size of the packets.

JUMPED OVERBOARD.—About 11 o'clock on Saturday night last one of the men who left here for the C. P. R. works at Thunder Bay, jumped overboard from the Propeller Enterprise between Little Current and Clapperton Island. The Enterprise was immediately stopped; a boat lowered; and although it was a very dark night the body of the unfortunate man was recovered. The name of the man was Patrick Burns, of Buffalo, and he was suffering from delirium tremens at the time. His body was conveyed to the Sault Ste. Marie and interred at that place. —O. S.
