MILTON, Dec. 5.—At the meeting of the County Council of Halton, held here yesterday, it was resolved that a petition from that body should be forwarded for presentation at the next session of the Local Legislature, praying that the municipal and parliamentary franchise should be granted to women having the property qualification which now gives men the same privilege.
