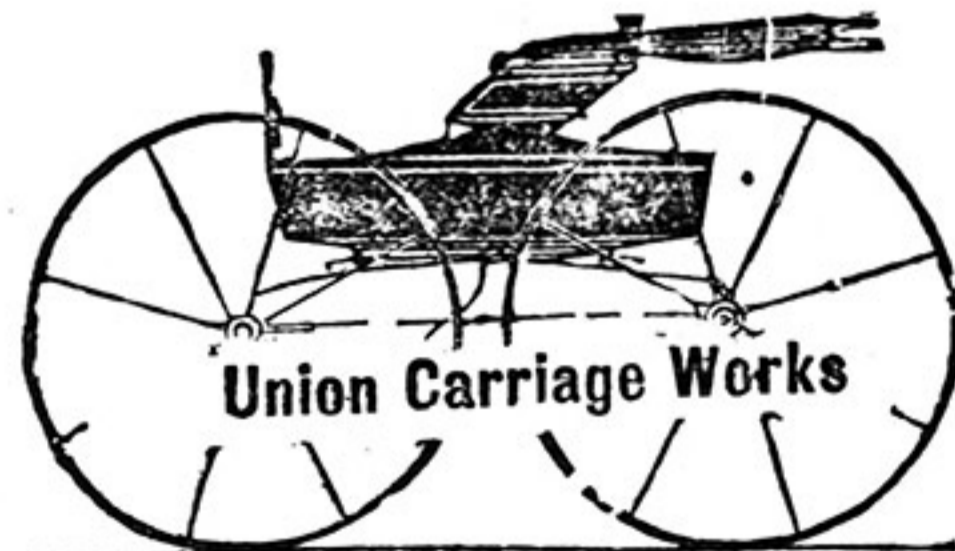

Holland Council.

Holland Centre Dec. 10th, 1883.

Council met at Vogan's Hall.

Reeve in the chair, members all present.

A resolution passed by the Euphrasia Council was read with regard to breaking up union S. S. No. 2.

McKinnett, Deavitt, that Richard Lyous be paid three dollars for removing stones off road, on 12th con.

A communication was read from Dr. McClelland with regard to James Campbell removing his fence off the street in beat, No. 3 side road.

The Council is of the opinion that the township By-Law is sufficient in the case and that the power rest in the pathmaster.

Deavitt, Shute, that the west part of lot 2, in the 2nd con., be put on the assessment roll and be extended on the collectors roll.

Shute, Galbraith, that an order be issued to Wm. Teffour for the amount of \$4.85, being back taxes charged against lot 21, con 2, in error.

Shute, McKinnett, that the sum of \$1.55 be refunded to Edward Fagan, as taxes charged in error.

Galbraith, Deavitt, that the agreement between Holland Township and James Farley with regard to gravel pit on Farley's property be signed and sealed by the Reeve.

Galbraith, McKinnett, that Harry Baker get an order for \$5, to buy necessities for his family.

McKinnett, Deputy Reeve, that \$20 be expended on 3rd con. East between 50 and 60 side road.

Deavitt, Galbraith, that George Hughes be notified to cause Andrew McQuaker to take his fence from off the road on No. 6.

Galbraith, Deavitt, that the acct. of A. B. Simpson, for attending court of revision at Chatsworth, be paid.

McKinnett, shute, that \$5. be granted to repair road on 2nd con., west, between 50 and 55.

Galbraith, Deavitt, that the Reeve look after repairing bridge at Chatsworth and put in bill in accordance.

Galbraith, McKinnett, that the following widows be exempted from paying taxes for the year 1883: Widow's Matthews, McGregg, Deavitt, Chambers, Graham and DeDiermid.

Galbraith, Shute, that the following persons be refunded the following amounts: John Malow, \$1.60; Pat Burman, \$3.00; M. Omara \$3; Owen McGowan, \$3; John McCartney, \$1.90; Mrs. B—\$1.40; T. McCarty, 55cts.

Shute, Galbraith, that an order be issued in favor of Donald elder on account of error in assessment.

Shute, Galbraith, that five dollars be granted to make culvert opposite Richard Clark's.

Galbraith, McKinnett, that Martin McLean receive the sum of three dollars for road work performed in 1882.

Deavitt, Galbraith, that By-law No. 8 appointing polling places and returning officers, be read 1, 2, and 3 times and engrossed on the minutes.

Deavitt, Galbraith, that this council adjourn sine die.

Euphrasia Council.

The Council met pursuant to adjournment on the 7th day of December 1883.

Members all present.

Minutes of last session of council read and confirmed.

The collector was authorized to receive W. McAlley's taxes, less \$2, charged for statute labor, and Dan Millar's taxes less \$3, charged for statute labour, as these parties have performed said labour.

The collector was authorized to receive the taxes charged against the N. 1 of lot 7, con. 12, less \$6 charged for statute labour, said labour having been performed by permission.

The time for the collectors to return their rolls was extended.

The treasurer was instructed to remit as follows, viz.: G. Cruikshanks, \$4, repairing road scraper and work on bridge; Messrs. Andrews, Thornbury, \$1.60, for spikes used on bridge; A. McGill, Chatsworth, \$36, payment for road scrapers.

The Reeves orders were issued on the Treasurer to pay as follows, viz:

James Falls, \$10, service as janitor of Town Hall; John Jobe, \$1.25,

labour on 18 and 19 side line; John McArthur \$3, labour on 12 and 13

side line, con. 8; William Irwin \$1.50

repairing culvers; S. Wiley, \$1.70,

plank for culvert; William Kerr, \$5,

labour on 9 and 10 side road; John McCallum, 50cts, removing fence on

deviation side line, con. 1; Christopher Knott, \$42, building bridge;

Henry King \$3, said amount being charged in error for statute labour.

The council adjourned until the last Friday in December.

Glencol Council.

This council met at the Town Hall on the 10th inst.

All members present.

Orders were issued on the Treasurer in payment of work on roads and

bridges to the amount of \$1,834.73, as follows: Ward No. 1, \$152.13;

No. 2, \$716.60; No. 3, \$214; No. 4 \$252.

Accounts paid—W. R. Rombough, conveyancing and diagrams, \$10; T. Lauder, registrar fees, \$5.40; I. Elder, mending scrapers, \$2; The Clerk postage and stationary, \$1.69;

The Clerk, service under the school act \$15; A. Cochrane, road scraper, \$8; Provision and attendance to S. Cope, as charity, \$21.84; the taxes

against the first and second divisions of lot 23, con. 1, E. G. R. reduced to \$15.75, and the taxes against lots 11,

12, 13, and 14, con. 3, S. D. R. reduced to \$5.98. Arrears of taxes against lot 4, con. 9, struck off the roll.

Mrs. McDonald, Mrs. Wilkie, and Thomas McGrade, were exempt from taxes for 1883.

The Reeve, Clerk and Assessor were allowed \$4 each for selecting Jurors.

The members of the council remunerated themselves for services on committees, to the following extent:

The Reeve, \$10; the D. Reeve \$4; Davis, \$16; McMillan, \$8; Duns-

moor \$6.

Charles Moffat, Wm. Smellie, H. McKee, Kenneth McKenzie and John S. Black were appointed deputy returning officers for next municipal election.

The commissioners were allowed eight per cent on road expenditure as follows: Davis \$11.02; McMillan, \$34.92; Mullarky \$17.12; Duns-

moore \$21.24.

After the usual 'vote complimentary' to the Reeve, the council adjourned sine die.
