CHEESE FACTORY.

A meeting was held on Saturday last, in the Orange Hall, for the purpose of electing officers and other business in connection with the establishment of Markdale cheese tactory. There was a large attendance of the farmers of the district, all of whom appeared enthusiastic on the factory question. Mr. Garrett, of Flesherton cheese factory, was present, and gave valuable information in reference to the management of the business. The following officers were elected: -Mr. B. Coleman, President; Directors-Messrs. John Boland, John Hutchinson, John Whitby, Wm. Jackson, jr., Wm. McLoughry, H. McKee, Wm. Brown, Euphrasia, H. D. Irwin, Jas. Wright. The directors elected Mr. Thos. Boland as secretary. The business is to be managed on the same principle as that of the Flesherton factory, viz: The patrons guarantee the milk of a given number of cows each, making in all not less than 200 to be delivered at the factory in good condition and pure, while the proprietors of the factory bind themselves to make a first-class article at a certain price per lb., the directors, or one of themselves whom they appoint for the purpose, make sale of their product from time to time, as the market and other circumstances suit. Messrs. Elliott and Carson are now making vigorous efforts preparing for the erection of the factory which they will have ready for operation by the 1st of May.
