> To DRIVE AWAY RATS. - Mary Hadlem writes that rats have so strong an aversion to the odor of peppermint, they will not enter rooms or bins where it prevails. She says of the peppermint plant: "We place it in the oats, rye and corn, when they are brought in, and some goes under the pig-stye. Though we no longer have any rats, we continue to use the plant, for fear they might make us a visit." If this is so, in the absence of the plant, probably a few drops of the oil of peppermint would answer the same purpose. -- American Agriculturist


