NEWSPAPER LAW.

Any person who takes a newspaper registered under the post office, whether directed to him or another's, or whether he has signed or not—is responsible for the payment of the same.
If a person orders his paper discontinued, he must pay all arrears, or the publisher may continue to send it until payment is made, and then collect the whole amount. If the paper is taken out of the office of the publisher, he is responsible for the payment of the same.
If subscribers refuse or neglect to take their papers from the office to which they are directed, they are held responsible until they have settled their bills. The Courts have decided that refusing to take newspapers and periodicals from the office, or removing and leaving them at home, is PRIMA FACIE evidence of intentional fraud.

Death of Vennor.

GENERATED METEOROLOGIST CARRIED OFF BY RHEUMATISM.

MONTREAL, Que., June 9.—Henry G. Vennor, aged 45, died yesterday of rheumatism, with which he had been laid up for a long time.

The late Mr. Vennor was educated in the High School, Montreal, and went on the Geological Survey some fifteen years ago. He was employed in Manicoulin Island, and afterwards in North Hastings county. Subsequently he was promoted in the Geological Survey, and had charge of explorations on the north side of the Ottawa. It was while in these explorations that his attention was drawn to the possibilities of weather forecasting. A few years ago he resigned his position on the survey and opened an assayer's office in Montreal. He was a fellow of the Royal Geological Society of England, and the author of a work on the Birds of Canada. For some time past he had been in ill-health, being a sufferer from spinal disease. Lately he had to give up work completely, and was confined to bed. Mr. Vennor's father died a couple of weeks ago. Mr. A. H. Vennor, with Rice Lewis & Co., on Toronto street, Toronto, is the uncle of the late Mr. H. G. Vennor. In forecasting the weather Mr. Vennor's chief reliance was upon the resemblance which certain periods of weather in the past bore, in regard to their general curves of temperature and rainfall, to weather immediately preceding the time of his forecast. He naturally assumed that where two distant periods were much alike, the weather which followed would also be much alike. Of course there were also many other indications which aided him in forming an opinion of the probable weather. Of the effect of the conjunction of the planets on terrestrial weather he did not assume to know anything, and no doubt ridiculed prognostications founded upon them. In the whole his methods had a measure of practical common sense about them, and were considerably superior to that of so-called weather prophets of an older time.
