Meeting of Presbytery.

The Presbytery of Saugeen met in St.
Andrews Church, Mount Forest, on Tuesday
the 22nd inst. The resignation of Rev. J. Mc.
Millan and Rev. D. Fraser, of Mt. Forest,
which had been laid on the table at the meet-
ing in Durham, were accepted; the latter to
take effect on the 4th of August, and the for-
mer on the 1st September.

The union of St. Andrews' and Knox's,
Mt. Forest, was agreed to most harmoniously;
the resolution uniting them being carried
without a dissenting voice.

Rev. M. Thom of Arthur was appointed to
preach on first Sabbath of September before
these congregations and declare their pulpits
vacant. Rev. J. Campbell of Harriston was
appointed to preach to both congregations
assembled together in Knox's Church, on the
second Sabbath of September, and to declare
them united into one charge under the name
of the "Mount Forest Presbyterian Church."

Rev. Mr. Fraser is to take charge of the
Presbyterian congregation in Victoria,
Vancouver Island. He will leave for his
distant field about the second week in
August.—Com.
