EAST GREY FALL SHOW.

The above exhibition was held in the Society's grounds, Flesherton, on the 28th and 29th Sept. The number of entries were within three of being the same as last year, while the receipts at the gates showed a large increase in attendance. The show inside the hall was as good, if not better than any previous exhibit. Grain was an excellent quality through out and the exhibit was large. Roots, though not so large as we have seen, was a good average quality. There was a fine display of fruit, the best we have yet seen at a county show, and the exhibit far above the average in quantity. Flowers were also more numerous than usual which added much to the appearance of the hall. Ladies work in the various classes was well represented and in many instances of a high order. There was a very large and creditable collection, of photographs, which drew special attention and were much admired by spectators. Mr. J. Hamilton of Markdale, and Mr. Jas. Bulmer of Flesherton were the exhibitors, the former taking first prize. A pencil drawing of Eugenia Falls which hung at the West of the fruit stand arrested our special attention, the scene being a familiar one, and the drawing so perfect we were led to inquire, who it was that executed the work, when we learned that it was Miss Edith Richardson. There was not a very large exhibit of dairy products, but the quality was fine.

The quality of horses as well as the number continue to improve from year to year; the exhibit this year was decidedly good. In cattle however the show was below an average. Sheep and pigs were fair, implements and machinery scarcely up to the average in numbers. The exhibit of poultry was large and fine; this branch (if it may so be called) of farming is now a very profitable one, and claims special attention, we have not the space to go into full particulars of this show, but would here compliment the directors of the Society on the success which has attended their arduous labors.
