## GLENELG FALL SHOW.

Last Thursday and Friday, Gleneleg Agricultural Society held their fall exhibition. The first day was wet throughout, and no doubt hindered many from bringing articles to the hall which were previously entered; however the hall was well filled. The following morning was very gloomy but towards 10 o'clock, old sun broke through the scattering clouds, and a lovely day followed. The grounds presented a very handsome appearance being clean and dry notwithstanding the great quantity of rain which had recently fallen, and had only a few hours to dry off. The hall presented a very creditable appearance, being well arranged with the various exhibits which surpassed in appearance and quality that of East Grey Show. The hall is not more than half large enough for the proper display of exhibits in this rapidly growing fair. The poultry house attracted considerable attention and called forth many expressions of admiration on account of the neat and convenient arrangement of the building, as also the number and quality of the exhibit in this class. The show of horses was very good, as also the cattle. W. J. Shepherdson, of Enphrasia, had a fine lot of sheep, but had that department nearly to himself. There were also a good grade of pigs. Everything passed off quiet, orderly and most satisfactory, and those who attended were highly pleased with the general management and fair throughout. ## The Manitoba Crop.

WINNIPEG, Oct. 2.—Telegraphic reports, covering nearly all the districts of importance, say that the wheat harvest is completed; some crops are yet left out. A good deal of threshing and some marketing has been done. Wheat is reported as averaging from twenty to forty bushels; in various districts it will probably average at least twenty five. The quality is reported good. Fall plowing is rather backward, though the weather is now fair and settled.
