BARN BURNED.—Mr. Henry Boyce  
 lost his seasons crop yesterday morn-  
 ing before daylight by the devouring  
 element. The barn, which was a  
 large frame, was filled with fine grain,  
 the product of 50 acres. There was  
 in the stable adjoining, a span of horses  
 6 cattle, 9 pigs, also hens and ordinary  
 contents. The horses, cattle and pigs  
 were saved by a desperate effort. The  
 origin of the fire is a mystery, as Mr.  
 B. had no lantern or light of any kind  
 about the barn the evening previous.  
 The fact of having found, one morn-  
 ing about two weeks since, a bottle of  
 whiskey and several partly burned  
 matches in the barn, leads Mr. Boyce  
 to suspect tramps, who may yet be  
 found in the ruins. Mr. Boyce's loss  
 will not be less than \$1,000, with  
 \$500 insurance. It is not known  
 whether Mrs. Reid (who owned the  
 barn) had it insured or not.
