## Euphrasia Council.

The council met pursuant to adjournment on 5th Dec. 1884. Members all present. Minutes of last session read and confirmed.

The amount of \$76.85, which was charged as arrears on the Collectors Roll for the year 1883, against the S E 1/4 of lot 2, con. 4, was struck off said roll as the County Treasurer's receipt for the same was produced.

A resolution for a new survey of the Walter's Falls road, was moved and seconded but lost.

By-Law No 341, establishing a deviation road in the second concession; By-Law No. 342, to close and dispose of part of the original allowance of road in the second concession, and By-Law No. 343, appointing deputy returning officers to hold the next municipal election, and appointing polling places, were carried through the different stages and passed.

The Reeve's orders were issued on the Treasurer to pay as follows, viz: To J. McIntyre, \$7, road work; J. Farewell, \$88.20, printing up to date; W. Rea, \$4.25, road work; J. Struthers, Esq., \$11, service as school referee; J. Homes, \$118.02, road work; J. Keenev, 50 cents, road work; J. Wilson, 75 cents, road work; John Feeney, \$6.25, road work; H. Hurd Esq., \$23.12, to pay for work on bridge; R. Loughheed, \$9, repairing bridge; W. Hewgill, Esq., \$13 26, plank and labour on road; R. Allen, \$7.25, road work; G. Blackwood, \$26 road work; C. Knott, \$1, road work; W. J. Loughheed, \$6, road work; R. Camplin, \$8.50, road work.

Council adjourned until the last Friday in December, inst.

Moved by Mr. Galbraith, sec. by Mr. Howey, that James Ireton be exempted from taxes on account of having the misfortune of getting his stock of leather and most of his wearing apparel burnt by fire.

Moved by Mr. Galbraith, sec. by Mr. Howey, that pt. of lot No. 28, on the 6th con, be extended on the collectors roll for collection.

Moved by Mr. Willisroft, sec. by Mr. Howey, that Jas. Campbell be refunded the sum of \$3.60, Henry Jackson \$1, R. Givens, 79 cents and R. Stewart \$1, being errors on the assessment roll.

Moved by Mr. Willisroft, sec. by Mr. Galbraith that the following widows be exempted from taxes:—Mathews, Jackson, McGregor, Graham, Chambers Thos. Shes and Samuel Watson.

Moved by Mr. Galbraith, sec. by Mr. Norton, that Samuel Watson get an order for ten dollars on treas. being in indigent circumstances.

The Orangeville Gazette has been purchased by Messrs. Ketchum & McGuire. They propose to alter the paper in form, appearance and politics, to change the name, and to print it all at home.

Wm. Garbutt of amaranth, plowed a field of sod this month.

Mr. Samuel Edge, of Glenora, recently killed eight hogs which when dressed weighed over a ton. Seven of this number were May spring pigs, and averaged about 250 pounds each.

Mrs. KIRVAN has moved from Dundalk to Meaford, and has opened a millinery and fancy goods store.

Euphrasia cheese factory has wound up business for the year with satisfactory results.

Five inches of snow fell at St. Louis last Thursday. Storm was general throughout the West.

The total arrivals of immigrants in the Dominion for the eleven months from January 1st to November 30th, were 144,842, of which 84,198 were intending settlers.

The total majority in Brant county, for the Scott Act is 601.

The Thornbury lodge of A. O. U. W. have contributed \$20 to the suffering brethren of the late Port Perry fire.

George E. Wingate, who absconded from Toronto a few days ago with nine thousand dollars, was arrested on Sunday in New Orleans.

A public meeting was held in Toronto on Saturday evening to discuss the question of the abolition of tax exemptions, when a resolution was unanimously passed in favor of the movement.

Lord Dufferin has arrived safely at Calcutta. A special to the Mail says he was very warmly welcomed and the city was magnificently illuminated at night.

REV. DR. RICE, senior superintendent of the Methodist Church, died Monday afternoon after a protracted illness, at the advanced age of 69 years.

The pan-cake social took place at Orangeville last week all right, and there was both honey and molasses, but there was no salt in the pan-cakes.

Wm. Duke of Lyons Head has been arrested and lodged in Walkerton jail to await his trial for embezzling township funds and making false entries on the collector's roll for the township of Eastnor, of which he was collector.
