The Association will do business on the following plan:

Applications.

All Applications for Membership shall be made upon printed forms furnished by the Association, (and applicants must pass a satisfactory medical examination). If accepted, a certificate will be issued within thirty days from date of such acceptance.

Membership.

The payment of TWELVE DOLLARS admits any of sound body and mind between the age of 18 and 60 years, to all the benefits of the Association. If the application is not accepted the money is promptly returned to the applicant.

PATENTS

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Artemesia Council.

This Council met in the Town Hall, Flesherton, on Monday, Dec. 6th, '84. Present—Messrs. Christie, Pedlar, McArthur, Elliott and Blakley.

The minutes of last meeting were read, and on motion adopted.

A letter from Wm. Murphy, Toronto, re mill reserve No. 5, Eugenia, presented and read.

A petition from Richard Ludlow et al. asking aid for F. Millsap, he being in indigent circumstances, was presented and read, and he was granted four dollars per month.

By-laws 869, appointing Deputy R. O., and 870 to extend the time for the collectors to return their rolls was passed after receiving the necessary number of readings, &c.

The sum of \$15 was accepted from Mr. Riley for taxes on his lots in Priceville and the Clerk directed to request the Co. Treasurer to erase all taxes on his books against said lots. J. E. Sloan was refunded two dollars, being road work returned, charged in error. R. Oliver was paid \$2 and Duncan McArthur was paid 50 cents, read jobs in Ward No. 1.

Alex Smith was paid \$3 for road job in Ward No. 4. The school trustees' rate in the several sections was ordered to be paid to the respective trustees.

Mr. Elliott—Mr. McArthur,—That this council cannot take the action suggested by Mr. Wm. Murphy regarding the sale of mill reserve in Eugenia from the fact that there is no guarantee that said property would be improved land.

The business for the year having been concluded the Reeve was requested to vacate the Chair and the Deputy-reeve requested to take the same, when the following resolution was put and unanimously carried. Mr. McArthur—Blakley, that the thanks of the members of this council are due and are hereby tendered to the Reeve, Dr. Christie, for the very able and gentlemanly manner in which he has presided over his council, and discharged the onerous duties as Reeve of this township during the year now about closing.

Council adjourned sine die.

Storing Ice.

Every family should have ice for the summer. Hence build an ice house. Select some spot shaded if possible and protected from the wind. Every ice house should have a kind of cellar dug, which must be filled up with stones covered with a layer of sand. This will permit the water to escape. On the foundation place a common sill; on this put the plank upright and nail outside boards well battled; inside any rough boards will do. The aim is to make the wall hollow and thus prevent conduction of heat from the heated atmosphere; the space must be filled with saw-dust, tanbark or rough course chaff. Roof of common boards is all that is needed, well battled. Opening should be left on each gable end to permit a free draft. Door should be double and filled with saw dust. When ice is put in let water be poured over each layer to fill up the crevices and prevent entrance of air. At first a layer of saw-dust should be put on floor at least six inches or a foot deep. A foot space be left between ice and walls, and this space should be filled with saw-dust. Over the top layer a good thickness of saw-dust or whatever other material is used.
