FIVE SHOTS FIRED AT HIM.

Met Dangerously Hurt—His Ante-mortem Statement.

A last (Monday) night's New York despatch says: At twelve minutes past 5 o'clock this afternoon, as O'Donovan Rossa was passing in front of the Stewart building...

He then fell heavily to the sidewalk. The woman fired the remaining bullets in her pistol at the prostrate man, and calmly and unconcernedly walked off with the smoking revolver in her hand.

"YES, I SHOT O'DONOVAN ROSSA," said the prisoner, with a slight English accent. She looked very demure and pretty as she stood at the bar, and betrayed no excitement whatever.

DECLINES TO DIVULGE THE CAUSE OF THE SHOOTING, but it is presumed to have occurred through Rossa's dynamite schemes. As soon as the woman ceased firing Rossa got up on his feet...

At 8.30 the wounded man was resting easily, and said he was hopeful of pulling through all right. Captain Phelan, who is still guarded by policemen, when informed of the particulars of the shooting, smiled grimly, but refused to say anything on the subject.

To a reporter Rossa said: "It was a premeditated affair, and this woman was simply the engine by which the dastardly act was accomplished. She had no private revenge to gratify. No relative of hers had been injured in the English explosion."

About 9 o'clock Mrs. Dudley asked about the condition of Rossa, and seemed sorry when she heard he was still alive. A number of persons called to see her, but she positively refused to be interviewed.
