**COSTLY STUMPING.**—The trial between Brit and Godfrey respecting the burning of Garyowen has been concluded in favor of Godfrey. Brit set fire to the stumps in his field during the day time in Sept., which was the cause of the burning of Godfrey's dwelling house, out-buildings and otherwise damaging his property. Godfrey entered an action of damages to the amount of \$1000. The case was given over to be settled by arbitration, and placed in the hands of three farmers, but their decision did not come up to Godfrey's expectations as they only allowed him about \$250. By some means he managed to get the case placed in the hands of three Owen Sounders for arbitration, and after many days had been spent in examining a great "cloud of witnesses" Brit was presented with an account of nearly \$1000, Godfrey's share being about double of that allowed him by the farmers.—O. S. Advertiser.

**Holland Council.**

The Council met on the 7th inst. Members all present. The communications received from Wm. Brown, Markdale, in regard to giving a bonus to a railroad from Durham to Meaford, was laid on the table. John Douglas was refunded \$1.25—taxes over paid. On motion the Auditors' report was adopted—each to have \$6 for their services. A grant of \$10 was given to S. Watson, who is in indigent circumstances. The Reeve and Dep. Reeve were appointed a committee to investigate the Treasurer's security. The account of C. W. Rutledge was ordered to be paid. Moved by Mr. Galbraith, seconded by Mr. Shute, That we ask for tenders for the township printing, and the Clerk will receive them up till the 4th of March. The Reeve asked for applications for the office of Assessor, when the following applications were made: J. C. Kennedy, \$65; John Bain, \$60; W. S. Willisroft, \$90—John Bain's was accepted. Applications for the office of Clerk was also asked for, when the following persons made application: A. M. Anderson, \$140; John McDonald, \$125; Wm. Breen, \$120—the old Clerk was retained at a salary of \$145. By-law appointing Assessor and Clerk was then passed. Moved by Mr. Willisroft, seconded by Mr. Galbraith, That Geo. Little get an order for \$55 for collecting. On motion, the matter with regard to the Board of Health was left over till next meeting of Council. Council adjourned to March 24th.
