Cleveland Administration.

The inauguration of President Cleveland marks an era in American politics which, if the promises of the inaugural address are borne out, bids fair to be the most progressive the United States has yet seen. For twenty-three years the Republican party shaped the affairs of the nation, and during that time many abuses crept in. The Democrats, who come into power with Cleveland, have before them the work of reformation, and on the way in which they carry out that work depends the favor of the people. Cleveland came victorious through a desperate fight, in which the vilest means were resorted to defeat him, and there are thousands who would witness the failure of his administration with exultation. Judging from the character of the man, gathered from his utterances since his election, those who look for failure in him will be disappointed. He appears to be a plain, blunt man, of sterling honesty and lofty purpose, who will reflect credit upon those who choose him from the multitude as chief magistrate. His course will be watched with hopefulness by a large portion of the American people and with great interest in Canada, and on the other side of the ocean.—News.
