If some one would only lend me ten thousand dollars to start a fair, legitimate business I should be the happiest of men."-"What business are you thinking of?" said the physician, "I thought," responded the convict, "if I could only start faro bank and run it honorably I should be so happy."

Therefore, when you read in the daily papers, or receive circulars of stock brokers who attempt to allure you with tempting opportunities to operate on small margins. destroy the circulars and avoid the sending as you would a bunko steerer, or a runner for a faro bank.—American Agriculturist for April.
