Open Letter!

TO ALL TEMPERANCE WORKERS.

The members of the Flesherton Division of the Sons of Temperance, at its last session assembled, desired to express their convictions, in a very unanimous and decided manner, on vital points in connection with the Scott Act movement:-

First.—The great extent of the County, with its prominent places so distant from its centre, and therefore difficult of access, render necessary some well defined method by which communications, touching vital operations, may be quickly disseminated through the most distant as well as the most central points.

Second.—That men—public men—with undoubted reputation as Temperance workers; intelligent, with tact and push, in every part of the county, should be selected to impart the necessary zeal and give instructions as to the required procedure; so that a canvas shall be at once vigorous and enlightened.

Third.—It is the opinion of this Division, that without a more unanimous action, success cannot be secured. Isolated and irresponsible action, that rest only upon mere supposition and hope, will be ephemeral and worthless; and, therefore, some more business like and substantial method is advised.

Fourth.—We think no time should be lost in calling a convention to some central part of the County to discuss and resolve—

(a)—As to the efficiency of the present organization.

(b)—As to the present status of the Petitions before the Government.

(c)—The necessity of being again removed or otherwise.

(d)—The agencies best to be employed to obtain duplicate petitions.

(e)—The propriety or otherwise of bringing to the County celebrated speakers.

The Law of Libel.

What is being said by some of the public journals on the subject of libel and the libel laws is pertinent and proper. There is altogether too much facility afforded by the law to characterize individuals to enter actions against newspapers and carry a vexatious prosecution for which there is no good ground. Any person at all so pleased to imagine that he has been libelled by a newspaper may put to no end of expense by requiring it to "show cause," and doing other needless things required by the law. The best thing may not be a shadow of ground for the action at all. Another unfair feature of the law of libel is that a publisher may be dragged from one end of the Dominion to the other and put on trial for an alleged libel. Even if he secures a verdict in his favor, the expense to which he is put is something terrific. The law should at least be amended so that the publisher should have fair play. At present the libel is assumed to have been uttered wherever a copy of the paper circulates whereas it would only be fair if it assumed that it was uttered at the place of publication. We have no wish to see the laws changed in any way that would lessen the responsibility of the newspapers for what they publish, but it is unjust that they should be subject to vexatious prosecutions at the hands of characterless people.—Toronto Telegram.

The Wheat Shortage.

MILWAUKEE JUNE 26.—S. W. Tallmadge's monthly crop report says there is no longer a question as to the damage and loss to the winter wheat of this country. A falling off of 160,000,000 bushels in winter wheat from last year is unprecedented in the history of wheat raising in the United States. The present condition of spring wheat is good, but we must have favorable weather, till harvest. The estimates show the probable yield of spring wheat to be 181,000,000 bushels, winter wheat 210,000,000 bushels, or a total shortage of 182,000,000 as compared with last year.
