One of the properties conducive to durability in timber is its odoriferousness, which repels insect foes as a rule.

The process of curling feathers consists in heating them slightly before the fire, then stroking them with the back of a knife, when they will curl.

The increase in strength due to seasoning of different woods is given as follows-White pine, 9 per cent; elm, 12 3 per cent.; oak, 26.6 per cent.; ash, 44.7 per cent; beech 61 9 per cent.

Dr. Sydney Thompson suggests the folowing formula in erysipelas-Fluid extract of jaborandi, twenty-four parts; laudanum and glycerine, each four parts. This mixture is to be painted over the affected surfaces every four hours.

A good substitute for ground glass is made as follows: Work together equal parts of white lead and common putty until quite soft, then form it into a ball, and roll it over the surface of the glass, and a ground-glass appearance is the result.

Snoe-dressing : Gum-shellac half a pound, alcohol three quarts; dissolve, and add camphor one and a half ounce, lampblack two ounces. The foregoing will be found to give an excellent gloss, and is especially adapted to any leather the urface of which is roughened by wear.

Persons who use brass letters on glass windows or doors are often troubled by their dropping off, from unequal expension, or from too violent efforts on the part of the window-cleaner. The following is said to be a sure cement-it should be mixed just before using - Litharge, two parts; white lead, one part; boiled linseed oil, three parts ; gum copal, one part.

The following mouth-washes are recommended for sick persons, whose teeth and gums often become unhealthy through insufficient nourishment, medicines or want of cleansing-One part per manganate of potash to from one hundred to one hundred and fifty parts ci water, to which can be added some camp hor, as the metallic taste is dieagreeable; or a solution of baracic acid one in twenty or thirty; or the following-tincture of benzoin, ten parts; tannic acid, twenty parts; alcohol, thirty parts; oil of peppermint, a sufficiency. Put ten or twenty drops into a glass of water.

A Heartless Case.

A gentleman in the west of England, who was possessed of large estates, married a lady who was supposed to be a widow, her husband having left her many years before, and died-it was thought-abroad. After | store. several years of married life, the second husband, as he was believed to be, died intestate, and soon afterwards the lady also died. Then the brother and heir-at-law came forward and claimed the estates; and his claim being resisted, on behalf of the children of the deceased, the marriage was proved to be void, by the production of the lady's husband, with whom the brother of his successor had been in communication for many years. The husband, it appeared, had in the first instance come back to England in order to claim his wife; but having been met with by the unprincipled heir, the latter persuaded him to make no sign, but to subsist upon a weekly allowance from him (the heir), in order that the supposed husband might go to his grave in the belief that he was the lawful husband of the mother of his children; for the brother knew that no will had been made, and feared that if his elder brother—then a hopeless invalid -knew of the invalidity of his marriage, he would make a will in favour of his children and their mother. This scheme was successful; the gentleman died without making a will, a neglect which is always foolish, and often wicked. The heir succeeded to his brother's estates, both real and personal, being the sole next-of-kin as well as heir-atlaw; and the poor children were left utterly destitute.

Teeth in His Nose.

A small co'ored boy in Basseterre, West Indies, has two large teeth in his nose. A portion of his nose having been destroyed by ulceration, he was put under medical treatment for that disease, which soon healed with application of iodoform of potassium. The doctor's intention was to have made a new nostril for the boy, but while awaiting to make sure of the cure of the ulcer these beeth began to make their appearance. They seem to be the two central incisors of the permanent set : they spring from the floor of the nostrils at the sides of the bony septum, are freely movable, and are apparently attached to the mucous membrane only : they have little or no roots, but large growns,


