There is no valid reason, under present circumstances, why a measure of union for commercial purposes should be a stepping stone towards annexation. If our relations could be so improved, securing all the commercial benifits that annexation could bring, and at the same time retaining all the advantages of British connection. we believe the scheme would have very little opposition. To say the least, our commercial relations are in a most unsatisfactory state to the consumer, and any improvement would be hailed with satisfaction.


