Murder at Owen Sound

A HARMLESS JOKE AT A MAN'S APPETITE LEADS TO A FATAL QUARREL.

Owen Sound, Feb. 8.—To night. about 10 o'clock one of the most horrible crimes ever known in the vicinity of Owen Sound was committed. A colored man named Smoots, about 23 years of age, lost his life at the hands of another negro named Philip Roy, in the house of a colored man named Johnson. It appears Roy and Smoots came to Johnson's house to night, both under the influence of liquor, Johnson being absent, not having returned from work. When he entered the house Roy was eating at the table and Smoots making jokes at the quantity of food he ate. This led to a quarrel, when Roy attacked Smoots, who knocked Roy down. The lattter got up, and after wiping the blood off his face started for the deor with an oath. Smoots hearing this started after him, following him out, sharp instrument gave him a terrible sent for but before one could arrive he had expired.
