Lang vs. Wilson, et al.—This was an action for fraudulent misrepresentation—the goods of J. S. Moffett having been removed after dark to satisfy chattel mortgage of defendant, after the plaintiff had been induced to delay seizure for rent on representations that his claim would be arranged for.

Haggart vs. Myles.—Action for replevin of a threshing machine. Defendant consented to judgment for plaintiff. Masson & Masson for plaintiff; Wilson & Evans for defendant.

Hiscock vs. Wigley.—Action of judgment. Consent minutes being put in, judgment was given for plaintiff without costs. J. Masson, Q. C., for plaintiff; J. Creasor, Q. C., for defendant.

Gr. Vincent vs. Greenfield.—Action brought by Township against Greenfield for closing a road which the defendant claimed had never been properly opened and for which he had never received compensation and that the fence put up by defendants did not encroach on the alleged road.

Garig vs. Galloway.—Action on mortgage. Judgment by consent for foreclosure, defendant having a year to redeem. J. M. Kilbourn for plaintiff; J. Masson, Q. C., for defendant.

Blanker vs. Johnson.—Seduction suit, undefended; judgment for plaintiff, \$150. J. M. Kilbourn for plaintiff.

North American Life Assurance Co. vs. Paterson.—Judgment by consent, \$150. J. M. Kilbourn for defendant.

Queen vs. Philip Roy.—Murder. The evidence in this case was very similar to that given at the Coroner's inquest of which we give a full report. The jury returned a verdict of manslaughter. Prisoner sentenced to 10 years in penitentiary. A. Frost for Crown; J. Creasor, Q. C., for prisoner.
