The Keppel Tragedy.
JAMES WILSON COMMITTED FOR TRIAL.
The adjourned investigation into the Keppel murder case was resumed Thursday before Geo. Price, J. P. Fisher of Warton, the medical officer who held the post mortem on the bodies of the two murdered men, examined. He simply described the condition in which he found the bodies of Bailey and the hired man they were removed from the building. After the Doctor's evidence had been taken the Crown called to calling Ellen McClary, evidence had been already re-
There were no new witnesses produced, so the Magistrate decided to commit James King and Wilson to stand their trial at Assizes for murder. Ellen McClary was held as a witness, and unable to give bail, was committed to jail.

Hudson, McIntyre, that the collection time be extended until 30th May.—Carried.
Taylor, Hudson, that J. R. Sing be paid \$1 for use of Orange Hall and \$10 for use of Blackstock's Hall for Magistrates courts, he having received his fines to the Township treasurer of the county and that the reeve issue his order for the same.—Carried.
Taylor, Hudson, that the petition of John Wheeler and others asking for roads be laid over to the next meeting of this council.—Carrier.
McIntyre, Hudson, that Widow McArthur receive \$5 being in poor circumstances and that the Reeve issue his order for the same.—Carried.
Taylor, Hudson, that widow McFarlane receive a grant of \$4 being in poor circumstances and that the reeve issue his order for the same.—Carried.
Taylor, McIntyre, that James Christie be paid the sum of \$1.50 for repairing culvert and that the reeve issue his order for the same.—Carried.
Taylor, Hudson, that this council adjourn to the 28th May to meet as a Court of Revision at Maxwell.—Carried.
