A SOLDIER OF LUCKNOW

Some Stirring Reminiscences of The Indian Mutiny. On the 8th of June, 1857, twenty-nine years ago, just as England had emerged successful from the Crimean war, the great Indian mutiny broke out.

One of those who possesses the medal for the rebellion, with clasp, for Delhi and Lucknow, is Mr. William Kennedy, a caretaker at the Parliament Building in Toronto.

"I am W. Kennedy, of Kinross," said the veteran, "and I was born in the town of Innes, county, of Clare, Ireland. I will be 54 years of age next December.

At Delhi the fighting lasted from the 4th to the 20th of September. I was colour sergeant under General Nicholson there at the storming of the Moore battery.

WHAT OUR RATIONS CONSISTED OF when we were marching to the relief of Lucknow? One pound of wheat a day, and grind it yourself!

SECOND BATTLE OF AGRA, on the 8th of October, 1858. I remember marching these 36 miles with nothing to eat, then fighting, and then doing another 36 miles.

At daybreak the vessel was about a mile and a half off, and we were discovered and picked up at about 7 o'clock.

"Oh, they were brave fellows, and they told us that they were our friends."

There were 123,000 men, and not more than 10,000 of these were natives.
