

**The C. P. R. Exhibit.**

Exhibit of grains, grasses, fruits, roots, minerals and live stock, gathered from the Canadian Pacific Railway, Winnipeg and Columbia Valley, in Columbia, is attracting universal attention and admiration. Everyone who visits the exhibit is struck by the agricultural wealth (in the North-West of the grounds), where the exhibit is expressed astonishment at the wonderful progress that is being made in agriculture in the country traversed by the great highway. Wheat, barley, peas are shown in perfection. There are less than fifty different varieties of native grasses. The exhibit of fruits are almost as fine as can be seen in any part of Ontario. Rich specimens of copper, silver and iron ore are on hand. Probably the most wonderful collection in the collection are the specimens of Douglas fir trees from British Columbia. These specimens are seven and eight in diameter, and are admired of all. There are a large variety of the same. People who are interested in the natural resources of the great West should not fail to see this exhibit. Mr. A. Ducker and Mr. L. O. Armstrong are in charge, and they will be happy to give information they can to visitors. Specimens of live stock, native and crossed from the west of Calgary, are also to be seen. The C. P. R. exhibit is one from the Grant district in the county of Hamilton. The specimens of grains, roots and fruits are very creditable indeed. They are collected together by the natives and taken down to the fare in charge of Mr. Wm. Fielding, the Government immigration agent, and Mr. Fielding will always be near the exhibit.—*(Toronto World)*
