The Editor of the Flesherton Advance proposes adopting the strictly cash in advance system in regard to news paper subscriptions, similar to city papers.

If this could be successfully enforced, one of the greatest hardships and annoyances of the country publisher would be removed.

We can see no valid reason however why the strict cash system cannot be introduced and enforced. Our prompt paying subscribers would re-(what we mean by prompt paying representative. subscribers are those who renew say within a month of the date when their sub. expired, as well as those renewing generally before it had expired) because if such a course was decided on by the publisher, all names whether first class or doubtful would be struck off the list at a given time, say two weeks after the subscription had expired if not renewed. This would doubtless have the effect of decreasing the list of subscribers, at least for a time, but we are inclined to think the loss would not equal the gain, first, from supplying papers from year toyear to many who do not pay, and also of securing the amount in all cases inad. vance from those who pay when in arrears.
