Glenelg Council.

Town Hall Glenelg, Dec. 13th 1886. Council met this day pursuant to adjournment—all the members present,—the Reeve in the chair, minutes of last meeting read and confirmed.

McCuag-Binnie—That the following amounts be paid, being appropriation for roads in ward No., viz.

Carried. \$100.00

Lamb-Binnie—That cheques be issued for the following amounts for repair on roads viz.—John Hazard filling and repairing roads at lot 101 con. 3 W. T. & S. R. \$14.00. Thos. Jack repairing road at lot 5 con. 8, \$1.25 carried.

Lamb-Williams—That a cheque issued favor of Thos Russell to amount of \$36.00 for building culvert on Garafraxa Road at lot 20 con. 1, 1/2 of said

Lamb-Binnie—That Alexander McClung be granted \$10.00 for repairing road at lot 1 con. 14, and that he be allowed to proceed with the work forthwith under supervision of commissioner for the ward.—Carried.

Williams-Lamb—That cheques be issued for the following amounts, viz.—John Hopkins building 26 rods of crossway and clearing 8 rods of road on Townline Glenelg and Egremont, at lot 2, \$41.00, also to Henry Lawrence for clearing 46 rods of Townline and building 10 rods of crossway \$14.75 being half cost, also to Thomas McFadden for building culvert at lot 1 con. 1 S. D. R. \$3.00.—Carried.

Lamb-Williams—That \$1.25 be paid to John Tuohy for breakage to his plough on road work, the same having been certified by pathmaster.—Carried.

Binnie-Williams—That John Morrison be paid \$7.50 for wagon broken on roads as certified to by pathmaster.—Carried.

Lamb-Williams—That Isaac Elder be paid \$1.25 for repairing road scrapers.—Carried.

McCuag-Lamb—That Archd. Muir's account of \$3.00 for repairing road scrapers be paid on furnishing pathmasters certificate to treasurer.—Carried.

Williams-Lamb—That William Brown of Markdale be refunded the sum of \$8.00 being amount expended by him for burial of Robert Montgomery.—Carried.

Binnie-Lamb—That the Reeve, Clerk and Assessor be paid \$4.00 each for selecting Juries.—Carried.

Binnie-McCuag—That the amount of \$34.35 back Taxes against 43 Sydenham St. Markdale be struck of the Roll as the same was charged in error.—Carried.

Binnie-McCuag—That the following parties be exempted from taxes for 1886, viz Archd. McDonald lot 24 con. 2, E. G. R. Alexander Duncan lot 14, con. 12, Charles Kennedy lots 17 and 18 con. 1 N. D. R. Alex Smith 89 and 96 con. 3 W. T. & S. R. lot 22 con. 12. Mary Wilkie lot E J 14 con. 2 E. G. R. Fanny Smith lot E J 30 con. 3 E. G. R.—Carried.

Williams-McCuag—That Geo. Lamb be paid \$2.00 Geo. Binnie \$2.00 Christie Williams \$6.00 Chas. Moffat \$4.00 for letting and inspecting work on special grants, and Archd. McCuag \$8.00 for commission on ward appropriation.—Carried.

McCuag-Binnie—That the reeve and Clerk be paid \$2.00 each for services re. "Land Improvement Fund."—Carried.

Lamb-Williams—That cheque be issued in favor of C. W. Rutledge for \$12.00 for printing and Municipal blanks.—Carried.

Lamb-Williams—That \$2.00 per month from 1st December till 1st of May be granted to Mrs. Duffield, she being unable to support herself and two small children.—Carried.

Binnie-McCuag—That whereas Glenelg formed one of a number of municipalities that gave a bond to the T. G. & B. Railways under county By-law 174 passed in the year 1871. And whereas part of the said municipality of Glenelg was incorporated into the town of Durham in the year 1872.

And whereas that portion of Durham formerly part of Glenelg has not paid its due share of said bonus under said by-law 174.

Resolved that this council request the County council of the county of Grey to take such necessary steps as will place that portion of Durham on a just and equitable footing with the rest of said group of municipality; and that the Reeve bring this matter before the county council.—Carried.

Binnie-McCuag—That whereas the deviation on gravel road across lots 21 to 30 inclusive on con. 1st S. D. R. have been encroached upon by the owners of said lots, and this Township not having the authority necessary to have the obstructions removed do hereby ask the county council to have said road opened in its proper width, and that the Reeve bring this matter before the county council.—Carried.

Williams-Lamb—That this council authorize the reeve to engage a surveyor to run a line on the Durham road between Twenty and Thirty, and that he be authorized to notify all parties whose fences are found to be on the road to remove the same or failing to cause the same removed.—Carried.

Binnie-McCuag—That cheques be issued for the special rates levied on the different School Sections, and also for the Special rates levied on Glenelg portion of village of Markdale.—Carried.

McCuag-Lamb—That the report of the Local Board of Health be received and adapted, and that the members of said Board be paid \$4.00 each for services in connection therewith.—Carried.

Binnie-McCuag—That the application of Elizabeth Caswell of Markdale for Licence for Pool Table be not entertained.—Carried.

McCuag-Lamb—The treasurer, accept \$1.24 Taxes against north half of lot 38 con. 3, S. D. R. and that the clerk instruct county Treasurer to erase the same of his Roll.—Carried.
