 4th. That this By-law shall come into force and take effect from the date and passing thereof.
 Done in open council this 3rd day of June 1887.
 BY-LAW NO. 4.
 To permit certain animals from running at large to settle the heights and description of certain fences.
 Whereas it is necessary and expedient to pass a By-law for the purpose of preventing certain animals running at large.
 Be it therefore enacted by the corporation of the township of Holland.
 1st. That it shall not be lawful for the following named animals to run at large within the limits of the said corporation (viz) horses of any description or age, bulls or calves over six months old, sheep of any description, boars of any age, pigs of every description, and breechy animals of every description, and every animal shall be held to be breechy within the measure hereof that shall at any time when not pursued by a dog or dogs or otherwise have leaped over or thrown down a fence not less than four and one half feet high.
 2nd. Any animal mentioned in the preceding section of this By-law may be impounded in any of the public pounds of the said corporation by any person residing therein and who has suffered or fears to suffer damages by any such animals so running at large and it shall be the duty of any pound keeper within the said corporation to receive any such animal when so brought to be impounded by any such party as aforesaid and impound the same whether any such person makes claims for damages or not and such pound keeper shall be allowed to receive claim and recover from the owner or owners of such animals or retain out of the proceeds of the sale thereof the following fees and shall be guided in the performance of his duties by the provisions of the 355 section of the municipality institutes Act of Upper Canada 23-30 vic. cap 51.
 1st. For receiving and impounding each such animal or litter of pigs 25c;
 2nd. Necessary food and water and attendance per day of 24 hours of time in proportion for each cow, calf, bull, steer or ox horse, 50c. pigs under 50 lbs live weight 25c, over 50 lbs 50c, and it shall be a preliminary or necessary condition and in no case more than six hours after the impounding of any such animal as being breechy the party impounding the same to furnish the pound keeper with a written affidavit taken before some magistrate or justice of the peace having jurisdiction with the said corporation in which shall set out a clear description of the animal and the time place when such animal committed the breach as herein before set forth and also distinctly negative the fact of the animal being pursued at the time of committing such breach and the pound keeper shall preserve such affidavit and reserve in addition to all other fees and charges the sum of 25c, from the owner of such animal or retain the same out of the proceeds out of the sale thereof and pay the same to the party impounding.
 Providing always it shall not need a second affidavit for the same animal but such animal shall be liable thereafter to be impounded at any time when found running at large and the pound keeper shall if no damages are claimed or paid to the party impounding re-

cover from the owner or retain out of the proceeds of sale not less than fifty cents each time impounded after the first and pay the same to the treasurer of the corporation within ten days and in default of such payment by the time and in the manner aforesaid the pound keeper shall be held to have fraudulently embezzled the same and shall be liable to prosecution thereof.
 This by-law shall take effect from and after the passing thereof.

 COURT OF REVISION.
 Town Hall Gleneig, May 28th 1887.
 Council met this day as a court of Revision, all the members present. The Reeve in the chair. John McLaggart entered as owner for lot 53, con 2, N. D. R. Angus McInnis entered as owner for lot 25, con. 4, N. D. R. Angus Beaton entered as owner for lot 21, con. 2 N. D. R. John McCoskerry entered as tenant for lot 4, con. 1. S. D. R. William Steadwell entered as owner for lot 1, con. 12. Hugh McKay, entered for tenant for lots 7 1st & 2nd div. of 10 con. 1. E. G. R. John W. Ford entered as owner for north end of lot 97 con. 2, S. W. T. & S. R. Norman McLellan, Archibald McLellan, Paul Nelson, Jr. Donald McLachlan and James Hislop entered as land holder's sons. Court adjourned to June 13th.

After the adjournment of Court of Revision the council met for general business, all the members present, the Reeve in the chair. Minutes of former meeting read and confirmed.
 Dunsmore—McMillan—That the clerk be instructed to procure a book for the purpose of recording all By-laws of this township, in, and to be known as the "Township By-law Book"—Carried.
 Lamb—McMillan—That the account of C. W. Rutledge of \$25.00 for printing and stationery be paid.—Carried.
 McMillan—Lamb—That the Treasurer receive \$9.07 for lots 24, and north 1/2 of 25, con. 7, and \$22.56 for lot 26 con. 10 being arrears of Taxes, and that the clerk instruct the County Treasurer to erase the Taxes on said lots.—Carried.
 Dunsmore—McMillan—That Wm. Fallice be paid \$2.00 for 2 cords of wood delivered at Hall.—Carried.
 Williams—Dunsmore—That the assessor be paid \$75.00 the amount of his salary.—Carried.
 By-laws 249 & 250 commuting statute labor and appointing pathmasters was passed through all their stages and ordered to be engrossed on the minutes.
 Williams—Dunsmore—That the sum of \$10 be granted to Charles McArthur to procure provisions and seed as he is in poor circumstances by reason of sickness.—Carried.
 J. H. Bliss waited on council and put in a claim of \$125, the value of a horse accidentally drowned in Traversmill pond.
 Williams—Lamb—That the Reeve, deputy Reeve and Mr. Dunsmore be a committee to inquire as to the corporations liability for Mr. Bliss' claim for damages, and to get legal advice in the matter if they think it necessary, and report at next meeting of council.—Carried.
 Council adjourned to June 13th.
