

Osprey Council.

The fifth meeting of this council was held at Faversham, on the 11th June. Members all present. Minutes of the meeting adopted.

Communications from Richard and 26 others, asking assistance to open out the 25th sideroad from the 10th to the 12th Con's; and respecting list of lands liable to be sold for arrears of taxes; road statute labor and non-residence.

McIntyre.—That \$100 be expended in each of the 5 divisions, that J. Hudson be commissioner No. 1; A. McGirr, No. 2; J. Speers, No. 3; J. Taylor, No. 4; and McIntyre, No. 5.

Speers, Tayloy, McIntyre, McGirr.

Hudson.—That J. Elliott be \$50 for his services as Collector.

McIntyre.—That the clerk be instructed to notify the council that this council intend to expend \$25 on the townline opposite the 37 to 41 on condition that the council grant an equivalent.

McIntyre.—That the statute labor be done in the road in which the land is situated.

Speers.—Taylor, in amendment, that the patimasters schedules be made out as in former years.—Lost.

Council adjourned till 8th July.

The council met at McIntyre, 8th July 1887. Members all present. Minutes of last meeting adopted.

Communications from Inspector of Taxes; amended report, B. S. Kerr, respecting the bridge over the River on 10th sideroad and 20th con., between the 5th and 20th sideroad, being in a dangerous state; B. Fawcett, account \$1.25, advertising Court of Revision, and one for printing 400 copies of reports for 1886; Joseph Taylor, report on 25th sideroad, between the 12th and 12th con's.

Speers.—Hudson.—That John Conran be assessed for West 1/2 lot 22, omitted, at \$500.

Hudson.—Speers.—That George Howell's name appearing twice on assessment roll for E 1/2 lot 9, con. 1, be withdrawn from one of the assessments.

Taylor.—McIntyre.—That this be instructed to the clerk to notify the council of Collingwood that this council intend to expend about \$10 of the townline east of Sykes' saw on condition that Collingwood grant an equivalent.

Speers.—McIntyre.—That A. McIntyre, J. Taylor, and J. Hudson, inspect the 20th sideroad, with power to expend \$25 if necessary, and report next council.

McIntyre.—Hudson.—That the clerk communicate with James Hudson, surveyor, with the view of having a survey of a deviation road made of con. 12, on 25th sideroad.

Speers.—Hudson.—That the clerk notify John Clark, Deputy Reeve of Collingwood, that this council will pay its share of the group.

Taylor.—McIntyre.—That where there is an undivided assessment, lying in one school section and partly in another, the clerk is hereby instructed to equalize the assessment according to the best of his judgement.

Order issued in favor of A. McLean, \$25, for statute labor charged and not now performed; A. R. Fawcett, \$1.25, for advertising Court of Revision and \$30 for printing minutes of council, 1886; W. Milne, \$50, on salary; N. A. McLean, collector, \$50, salary, and \$3.00 for postage and stationery.

Council adjourned to meet at Singersham on the 20th August.

owner of lot 18 and assessed as tenant for lot 20, con. 5, and that lot 18 be placed on the N. R. R. and that C. McD. Williams' assessment be reduced \$200.—Carried.
