ECLIPSE SAW MILN BURNED .- On Wednesday night, July 27th, about midnight, the saw mill about five miles east of Markdale, known as "Sparlings Mill," was discovered in flames, not however until the roof was about falling in, making it impossible to save anything. The fire raged fiercely, the lurid glare being distinctly seen at Markdale, There was, with the mill, from 100,000 to 150,000 feet of lumber burned. The loss on the mill is put at \$2,500 and on the stock \$1,500 insured for \$1,500. Wm. Lucas the owner, will therefore be the looser to the extent of about \$2,500. This will throw quite a number out of employment, as the mill did a large and steady business.
