

**ADDITIONAL NOTES.**

Three by-laws were voted on and passed in Toronto last Tuesday; No. 1 to raise \$100,000 for a drill shed, No. 2 to raise \$100,000 to build works to protect the Island. No. 3 to raise \$100,000 for water works.

—It is announced that the Imperial Government has decided to grant a subsidy to the Canadian Pacific Railway. It is hoped to make the new route a great source of advantage to English speculators.

—Montreal had a \$100,000 fire on Tuesday last.

—London, England, has police force of 13,849 men.

—At a meeting of gentlemen connected with agricultural societies throughout the province, held at the Boscain House, Toronto, on Tuesday, the 26th July, to discuss the advisability of memorializing the Ontario Government to grant aid towards centralizing fairs or exhibitions, the general opinions appeared to be that township shows have outlived their usefulness, and that Central Fairs must now take their place, although some present spoke strongly in favor of the townships shows, and would oppose anything which would interfere with the grants now made by government to those institutions. The following resolutions were carried unanimously:—"That this meeting, believing that the time has arrived when the Provincial Legislature should be asked to give grants to such of the central exhibitions as may be established on such financial basis and under such rules and regulations as may be laid down by the government, resolved, that the chairman and secretary be instructed to call a general meeting of the representatives of the different central exhibitions in Ontario in order that this matter be more thoroughly discussed and placed in a proper shape, said meeting to be held some time in the month of January, 1888, at Toronto.

**Mormons at Riverview.**

Such a scene as occurred was indescribable. Barking and dipping of dogs, expostulations and insults by the preacher (?), cheers from some present were things that occurred. Last week as a party of Mormons were driving out, a barricade was thrown up by some parties on the road, but when the parties who did it considered the danger that might happen in the darkness, it was thrown down; but avail was had to the use of rotten eggs, which were thrown freely at the "Saints" by some party or parties unknown. Such a sight as the day light presented next morning when eyes were fastened upon occupants, equipage and equines and earthly wardrobes is simply indescribable. The community is resolved that the sect shall have no position or progress here, and it has the whole strength of the moral and religious people at its back, although, perhaps, the measures used for its extirpation, is not sanctioned by the latter.—[TRUTH.
