Progressive Africa.

Two enterprises now under way in Africa bid fair before many months to give us some interesting information about the two largest regions that are still entirely unexplored. On the latest maps of the Congo Independent State it may be observed that fully one-half of the territory between the Sankuru River and the great northern bend of the Congo is entirely blank. It is this region which Lieut. Wissmann set out to explore in November last. News has just been received of the arrival of this able explorer early in April at Lake Tanganyika. He had passed several months in the unknown countries between his former route across the continent and Grenfell's riverine researches on the north. He intended to reach the Indian Ocean by way of Lake Nyassa and the Zambesi. When he returns to Europe he wil have travelled twice across the continent from west to east. It is believed the region he has visited is very populous and that he will bring home much interesting infor-

In this is the hypothetical Lake Liba, but we are not certain that this supposed large lake exists, nor have we a particle of reliable information about a region that is as large as the State of New York. They will doubtless be able to settle some important questions.
