#### MISS RHETT MYRON'S STORY

Raby's Picture, a Soldier's Death, a Go

The death of Cel. W. R. Smith, which took place in New York a few weeks ago, has brought to light a very remarkable incident. Miss Rhett Myron, the principal figure in the drama, is a personal friend of your correspondent, and from her the following facts have been obtained, with per mission for their publication. Hayne Myron, the father of this young lady, was a planter in South Carolina. His home was a typical Southern home, spacious and hospitable, surrounded by broad acres and faithful slaves. His family consisted of his wife and Rhett, who was then a little child. the breaking out of the war, in the fall 1861, Hayne Myron joined a volunteer South Carolina regiment. Before leaving home he had a picture of his little painted in miniature, and encased it locket that he placed next to his heart. Inevery age of the world men have been suddenly called from the business of earning their livelihood to higher work in the service of God or their fellows.

Miss Gordon-Cumming, the well-known traveller in the more remote parts of the world, gives us a remarkable instance of this in the story of a workman in a saw-mill in Scotland, who, by the loss of an arm was compelled he gave up his trade, and become a colporteur in Glasgow. While thus employed, he was so much interested in the blind men who bought books in embossed evening to learn all the different systems of

The poor missionary conceived the idea of lifting them at least up to the level of their fellows, by reducing the Chinese language to the blind symbols and then by teaching them to read it. When we remember that this language consists of five must be committed to memory before a Chinaman with sight can read, we can understand how stupendous a task lay before

He was obstinately bent on accomplishing it, and during eight years gave all his leisure time to puzzling out a system which should enable the blind to read. He succeeded at last. The number of characters is so reduced in the embossed type that any blind Chinaman of average intelligence can learn to read fluently in two months.

During the nine years which have passed since he perfected his system, he has taught it to a large number of these poor creatures, inculcating at the same time the truths of the Christian religion, and has educated several young blind men to be efficient colporteurs.

As his pupils had no other means of livelihood than begging, he supported them while he was fitting them for work by his own scanty salary. He is endeavoring now to train intelligent men, who can see, to found a blind school in each of the eighteen provinces of China, but is greatly crippled by his poverty in this endeavor.
