**Glenelg Council.**

Town Hall Glenelg, Sept. 26th, 1887

The Council met this day pursuant to adjournment. All the members present. The Reeve in the chair. Minutes of last meeting read and confirmed.

The reports of road Commissioners were presented and passed as follows:

Ward No. 1, C. Williams, Commissioner, Expenditure, \$150.00.

Ward No. 2, J. A. McMillan, Commissioner, Expenditure, \$171.48.

Ward No. 3, Geo. Lamb, Commissioner, Expenditure, \$204.00.

Ward No. 4, N. G. Dunsmore, Commissioner, Expenditure, \$189.88.

A petition from A. McCormick and 17 others praying the council to compel certain parties to remove their fences off the road allowance was read.

Lamb—McMillan.—That the clerk notify Edward Middleton and Archibald McLean to remove their fences off the road allowance on side-road between lots 12 & 13, con. 1, E. G. R. and James Hall to remove his fence off the road at lot 10 con. 11.—Carried.

Williams—McMillan.—That the committee re-bridge con. 9, be granted discretionary powers to proceed with the construction of some means of communicating for that part of the township, petitions for said bridge, and report to the council at its next meeting, and that C. Williams be a member of the committee instead of Mr. Lamb.—Carried.

McMillan—Lamb.—That the report of committee on bridge at side-road 50, con. 2, N. D. R. be adopted, and that the committee be instructed to proceed with the work as soon as they find it convenient.—Carried.

Lamb—McMillan.—That the Reeve be instructed to meet the Reeve of Holland to repair "Allen's Sink Hole" and that he be authorized to expend such sum as he may find necessary to put the road in a sufficient state of repair, provided Holland grant an equivalent.—Carried.

McMillan—Lamb.—That Donald McCormick's taxes be reduced \$5.00, he having produced certificate of having performed Statute Labor, and that collector be notified to that effect.—Carried.

Williams—McMillan.—That Mr. Lamb be instructed to confer with Mrs. Caswell, agent the keeping of an orphan child now in her possession, and report to this council at its next meeting on what terms she will keep the said child.—Carried.

McMillan—Dunsmore.—That the Clerk's report re return of nonresident and defaulter's statute labor to the respective road divisions where in default be adopted and engrossed on the minutes.—Carried.

Dunsmore—McMillan.—That arrears of taxes \$1.48 as shown against lots 16 and 17 south of mill st. Priorville be erased, as the same is shown to be an error of assessment for 1884.—Carried.

Williams—McMillan.—That Catherine McArthur of Pricerville be paid \$2.00 for gravel for the benefit of the road, as certified by the pathmaster.—Carried.

Robert Bell and Samuel McArthur was paid \$8.00 and \$6.00 respectively as charity, up to Oct. 1st 1887.

The following accounts were ordered to be paid.

Rowell & Hatchison Municipal Manual, \$7.00; The clerk purchasing school rates on Collectors Roll, \$15.00; C. Williams Letting and Inspecting, \$12.16; J. A. McMillan Letting, Inspecting and committee work, \$14.00; Geo. Lamb, letting inspecting, \$18.00; N. G. Dunsmore, letting and committee work, \$2.00.

Lamb—McMillan.—That this council do not adjourn to December 10th instead of the 12th as previously published.—Carried.

Council adjourned accordingly.
