**Fatal Fire at Paisley.**

PAISLEY, Oct. 17.—This morning about 3.30 fire was discovered in a dwelling-house, occupied by Mrs. R. S. Ritchie. She and her youngest son are visiting in Toronto, and the eldest son, about 25 years of age, was living alone in the house. When first seen the fire was burning in the kitchen, which adjoined the bedroom of the young man. The bedroom window was broken in as speedily as possible, but before the young man could be rescued life was extinct. The four doctors of the town worked several hours with him, but of no avail. It is supposed he had been suffocated. The flames were confined to the one dwelling. The cause of the fire is unknown. Part of the furniture was saved. The house was insured in the Western Insurance Co., for \$400 or \$500. Messrs. Brown and Brown, who rescued the body, were burned in several places, but not very seriously.

**Euphrasia Fall Show.**

NOTWITHSTANDING THE UNFAVORABLE WEATHER THE SHOW FAIRLY SUCCESSFUL. The weather was anything but favorable for the World's Fair on Tuesday last. Rain fell freely in the morning, and during the afternoon a shower of snow drove the people into places of shelter. Consequent upon the rains of the week previous the roads were very sloppy. The funeral of the late Mr. Thomas McIntosh, of St. Vincent, which took place on the same day, prevented a large number of carrying out their intentions to be present, as also, doubtless did the Meaford regatta. Notwithstanding all these unfavorable circumstances, however, the attendance was large, and the gate receipts compared favorably with those of previous years. The show of horses, cattle, pigs, and sheep was unusually good. In the heavy draught class of horses, Mr. Wm. Carefoot, of Collingwood, obtained first prize, and Mr. Henderson, of Holland second. In general purpose brood mares, Mr. Robt. J. McAfee, took first, and Mr. S. Gilmore, second. In colts of the same class, Mr. R. J. McAfee's "King Tom" took first, and Mr. Jno. Conn's "Oak Branch" received first, and Mr. Jno. McKenzie's "Noageant," second. The exhibit of fruits, roots and vegetables was much better than could reasonably have been expected considering the nature of the season. They were shown by Mr. Jas. Brodie, of Arthemisia, and the grapes by President Crabtree, were equal to those received prizes at the Industrial. Reeve Gilray carried a number of first prizes in apples, etc., as also did his father, Mr. Robt. Gilray. Of butter there was an unusually large display. The show of grain was small. The ladies' work department contained many beautiful specimens, and sustained its reputation of being one of the best displays in the county. Upon the whole the exhibits were more numerous and of better quality than in previous years, and they compared very favorably with those of the other fairs.

NOTES  
 It is the custom of a society to allow a limited time for ladies only, to view the exhibits in the main building after the judging is completed. A few rude young men didn't believe in this system and forced their way through the entrance. A ring leader, one Norton, of Holland, wrenched constable Cook's stick from him, and undertook to control the situation. He will appear before Justice Myles, at Rocklyn on Saturday to explain his "gentlemanly" conduct. President Crabtree attended the funeral and didn't reach the grounds until late in the afternoon. Vice-President Gilray discharged the duties of the position very satisfactorily. For some reason or other the township hall, was not opened, and during the afternoon's storm people were forced to go into private residences to obtain shelter. The township fathers should see that the hall will be opened on such occasions in future. Mayor Grier, of Thornbury, was in attendance as also a number of the business men of that town. Markdale was largely represented, while from Meaford there was less than a dozen. The Euphrasia people are thinking of getting up a card of thanks to the promoters of the alleged "regatta" for the consideration they evinced for their rural customers. License Inspector Campbell, of Thornbury and a private detective were in town. These facts doubtless prevented a repetition of illicit liquor selling. Miss Milne obtained first, and Miss Myles second prize as lady riders. A local "tough" for some unaccountable reason wanted to "do up" a press representative. The latter didn't "collar" very bad, and created lots of fun for the by-standers by badgering Jumbo. Following is a partial list of the Judges: On horses: J. J. Irwin, V.
