The Poultry Show.—The exhibition of the Owen Sound and County Grey Poultry and Pet Stock Association held the past three days in the Town Hall, eclipses anything of the kind ever shown here. The Show is spoken of as being the largest and best yet held in the Province, a very large number of exhibitors from different parts being present. From 800 to 1000 birds were shown—the common varieties and excellence of which was a sight well worth seeing. The judge, Mr. I. K. Felch of Natick, Mass. (whose task of examining the points in each bird and pronouncing upon them, must have been an immense one), expressed himself well pleased with the fine character of the birds exhibited, as being second to none in the Province. We have no space for further comment this week but extend our congratulations to the association on the success of its exhibition—which we understand attracted more outside exhibitors than all previous exhibitions put together.—*Times*
