Council met for the transaction of business. Reeyes in the chair, members all present.

Minutes of former meeting read and approved.

F. McClean made application to pay his taxes they being omitted on the collectors roll. A note of the amount was taken and they are to be placed on the collectors roll next year.

Howey—Galbraith,—that we refund F. McClean the sum of one dollar and fifty cents being for road work overdone—Carried.

Shute—Galbraith,—That the clerk notify all pathmasters who have not sent in their statute labor list to state their reason why.—Carried.

Galbraith—Shute,—That the thanks of this council be and is hereby tendered to the auditors for the satisfactory manner in which they have made out their report and that the report be adopted and that they receive \$10.00 for their service.—Carried.

Galbraith—Howey,—That the supplementary auditors report be read and placed on the minutes.—Carried.

Shute—Howey,—that the clerk prepare a by-law for the appointment of an assessor and that the amount be \$70.—Carried.

Williscroft—Shute,—That a by-law be prepared for the purpose of changing lots 4 and 5 in the third range W. T. & S. road in the township of Holland from No. 1 section and attach the same to S. S. No. 11 and that all parties interested be notified.—Carried.

Galbraith—Williscroft,—That we extend the time for receiving applications for the office of assessor until the next meeting of the council.—Carried.

Shute—Howey,—That a vote of thanks be tendered to Mr. Breese for the able manner in which he has served the township as treasurer and we express our regret at his giving up the office.—Carried.

Shute—Howey,—That the salary of the treasurer be \$80.—Carried.
