1. Subscribers who do not give express notice to the contrary are considered as wishing to continue their subscription. 2. If the subscribers order the dis-


continuation of their periodicals the publisher may continue sending them over until all arrearages are paid up. 3. If subscribers neglect or refuse

- to take their periodicals from the office to which they are directed they are held responsible untill they have settled their bill and ordered them discontinued.
- 4. If subscribers move to other places and fail to inform the publisher, and the papers are sent to the former direction, they are held responsible. 5 The courts have decided that re-
- fusing to take periodicals from the office, or removing and leaving them uncalled for, is prima facie evidence of intentional fraud. 6. It subscribers pay in advance

they are bound to give notice to the publisher at the end of their time, if they do no not wish to continue taking it; otherwise the publisher is authorised to send it on and the subscriber 18 responsible until express notice, with payment of all arrears, is sent direct to the publisher.
