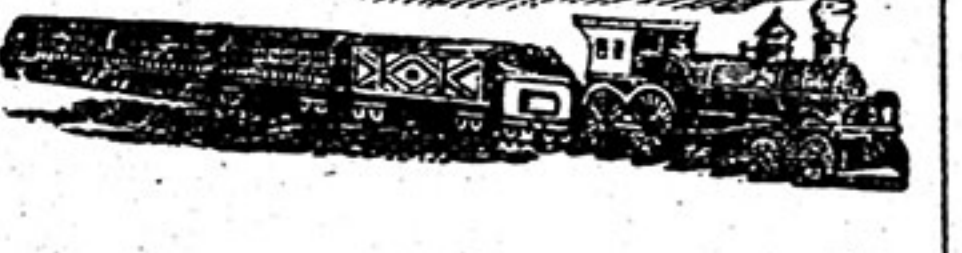

Fawcett, represent the District at the annual Conference.
A public meeting was held on Tuesday evening, at which addresses were given by Rev. Messrs. Endicott, Hosking, Ottowell and Thibadeau. The choir of the Methodist church furnished music and singing. The Rev. Geo. Buggin presided throughout with his usual urbanity and good cheer. With God's blessing resting upon the District, a rich outcome of results will tell for future good upon the prospects of the District; and its success will be assured.—Com.
