 A match game of base ball was played between Durham and Markdale on the grounds of the latter on Friday afternoon last. Considerable wrangling occurred among the contestants during the entire game and not result in anything serious. The game, though not finished, lasted about 7:30 p. m. when the game was to a close from a wrong decision by the umpire. Markdale was whitewashed twice and Durham once through injudicious batting. The boys all played well, and with a little practice we have no doubt they will take first place as amateur players. While Durham club have been organized for some years till this season, they play a good game. B. Curry, of the home team, did some good work catching fly balls from the bat, and in the same innings John Robinson, of the visiting club, got in some good work with the bat, also. McFarlane and Jackson, of the home team. Ed. Sproule ("the middle player") deserves more than a passing notice, having taken home base on one strike. Ed. is a sure catcher, a good backstop and a strong baseman. Robert Benson and Dave Anderson respectively did some good hitting, the former having taken home base and the latter third base on one strike. 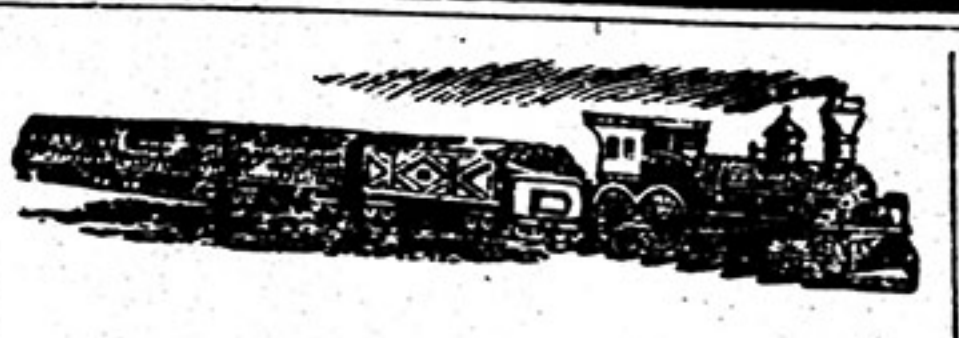
