The Game Laws.  
The following is from Judge Jellett's  
(Picton) excellent digest of the game  
laws:  
The only season during which the  
following game may be hunted, taken  
or killed is as follows:  
Deer—15th October to 15th Dec.  
Partridges—1st Sep. to 1st Jan.  
Woodcock—15th Aug. to 1st Jan.  
Snipe, rail and golden plover—1st  
September to 1st January.  
Ducks of all kinds—1st September  
to 1st January.  
Geese—1st September to 1st May.  
Hare—1st Sept. to 15th March.  
The above dates are inclusive.  
These may be exposed for sale for  
twenty days after expiration of time  
for killing. No eggs to be taken or  
destroyed at any time. No traps, nets  
or snares, baited lures or similar con-  
trivances to be used. These may be  
destroyed by any person without lia-  
bility. No contrivances described or  
known as batteries, swivel-guns, sunk-  
en punts or night lights to be used for  
killing wild fowl.  
Fur-bearing animals may be only  
taken, hunted or killed as follows:  
Beaver, mink, muskrat, sable, martin,  
otter or fisher—1st November to  
1st May. Nor shall any trap or snare  
or other contrivance be set for them  
outside this season. Nor shall any  
muskrat house be cut, speared, broken  
or destroyed at any time. Any person  
may destroy such traps, snares, etc.,  
so set, without any liability.  
N. B.—No poison to be used in kill-  
ing the animals named, and no poison-  
ing bait to be exposed in any locality  
where dogs or cattle may have access  
to the same.  
No deer-dog to run at large from the  
15th November until the 15th October.
