*Standard:*  
—Since Mr. Beattie's essay  
was published in your paper, it has been a question in my  
mind whether it was worth noticing  
it at this particular time in  
view of his experience. I think it may  
be well to give him a few notes  
for his benefit if he takes up the  
case again. I suppose he thinks it very  
important to call me a B. M., because I am  
the business manager of Lord Derby.  
There is nothing dishonorable  
in it, and I would much rather be  
the business manager of such a horse  
as Derby than owner and manager  
of the part he is so desperately  
desirous to get patronage for. In public  
and private conversation, he  
has spoken not only of the living  
Derby but the dead Garfield. In trying  
to throw doubts upon the truth of  
such a horse that lives and moves  
as he does, he says in his article "If he be  
so they represent him to be &c.,"  
then this live he had better be a  
careful in future of such false  
news for he may have some  
difficulty in explaining them away. He  
says his "horse is eligible for regis-  
tration in any Clydesdale Stud Book  
in the world." Well persons who  
no better may believe that but  
could have him registered in  
and I am sure he would have  
done so since seeing that *registration*  
is such a hobby with him, but  
papers which he has in his pos-  
session will probably turn out as  
the books from which he  
been trying to prove Derby's regis-  
tration wrong. Had he put up a  
card that his horse was duly regis-  
tered or could be in every Clydesdale  
book in the world he would have  
quite safe as no one would have  
been interested enough to question it.  
This bluff game will not work with  
Wright who will not leave enough  
time to extinguish a candle  
when he is through with him. When  
Beattie thrusts his challenge at us  
had two hundred dollars to squander  
the very next week when asked  
to bet his horse with Lord Derby by  
prizes to best colts from sand-  
ers he tells us he has no money—  
wants it all to pay his honest debts  
which is a very praiseworthy trait in a  
man, but finally when he comes or  
talks money and puts it up he tries  
to show it with stipulations and  
the most absurd by offering to  
the dealers, T. J. Graham and  
other backwoods Clydesdales because  
they possess, I give him credit  
when he says the people  
and Markdale are patronizing the  
horse. He says he never owned  
an imported horse well there are no  
books for advice but, if I were Mr.  
Beattie, I would sell the two he has  
but buy a good imported one it would  
be at least a partial payment on  
it. When he embarked in the  
trade I think his experience has  
been like unto the men who long ago  
came from Jerusalem to Jericho  
and his talk of sharpers and gulls  
and mongrel horses &c., &c. I have  
such experience, some of the best  
amongst enterprising men in Canada  
engaged in this business and are  
helping to enrich the country  
and success in breeding from Derby  
to Garfield but I know he has a colt  
which excels any that ever  
had on his farm and if he cal's on  
T. L. Young, Esq., he will convince  
him that his colts are eligible for  
registration, and with his extensive  
facilities for stock raising since, he  
is not a colt at all in his yard this  
season. Not satisfied with trying to  
prove Derby, he falls back on Garfield.  
Well Garfield was not here long but  
a reputation behind him that Mr.  
Beattie cannot injure and while he  
has a heavy loss to me I have the  
satisfaction of knowing that I helped  
to bring the first really first-class  
horse that ever came to Mark-  
dale and the people showed their  
appreciation of him so that when he  
left them heartily and readily advanced  
assistance to put another in his  
place, with the only stipulation that  
he be as good as Garfield and while  
some prefer one and some the other  
I have never heard a complaint that  
said agreement was not faithfully  
carried out. Now sir I am sorry to

RATEPAYER.

*The Game Laws.*  
The following is from Judge Jellett's  
(Picton) excellent digest of the game  
laws:  
The only season during which the  
following game may be hunted, taken  
or killed is as follows:  
Deer—15th October to 15th Dec.  
Partridges—1st Sep. to 1st January.  
Woodcock—15th Aug. to 1st Jan.  
Snipe, rail and golden plover—1st  
September to 1st January.  
Ducks of all kinds—1st September  
to 1st January.  
Geese—1st September to 1st May.  
Hare—1st Sept. to 15th March.  
The above dates are inclusive.  
These may be exposed for sale for  
twenty days after expiration of time  
for killing. No eggs to be taken or  
destroyed at any time. No traps, nets  
or snares, baited lines or similar con-  
trivances to be used. These may be  
destroyed by any person without liability.  
No contrivances described or  
known as batteries, swivel-guns, sunken  
punts or night lights to be used for  
killing wild fowl.

Fur-bearing animals may be only  
taken, hunted or killed as follows:

Beaver, mink, muskrat, sable, mar-  
tin, otter or fisher—1st November to  
1st May. Nor shall any trap or snare  
or other contrivance be set for them  
outside this season. Nor shall any  
muskrat house be cut, speared, broken  
or destroyed at any time. Any person  
may destroy such traps, snares, etc.  
so set, without any liability.

N. B.—No poison to be used in kill-  
ing the animals named, and no poi-  
soned bait to be exposed in any locality  
where dogs or cattle may have access  
to the same.

No deer-dog to run at large from the  
15th November until the 15th October.


