District Doings.
Palmerston had another serious fire last week.
Meaford dogs are being thinned out by poison.
Dundalk has one more vote than in 1887.
Roger's saw mill at Cedarville was burned last week.
Robt. Gillespie, hotel keeper at Shelburne has assigned.

J. J. Field shot a 66 lb., porcupine near Flesherton recently.
The Queen's Hotel, Owen Sound, was closed up by creditors last week.
Shead's mill with 15,000,000 feet of lumber, near Ottawa, was burned last week. Loss \$250,000.

The Owen Sound Summer Races are announced to come off on Wednesday and Thursday, August 15th and 16th. \$1,000 are offered in prizes.

Mr. Lanigan, Station agent at Dundalk is being removed to Three Rivers, Que., and Mr. Jos. Symington returns from Galt to his old position.

At a meeting of the Orangeville Presbytery on Monday the call from Erskine church, Toronto, to Rev. W. A. Hunter, of Orangeville, was sustained.

The Dundalk Herald is agitating a change in the formation of Grey and Dufferin counties, proposing that Proton, with Dundalk village, be annexed to the latter county and withdrawn from Grey.

A. F. & A. M.—Next year, according to the vote of the Grand Lodge in Toronto last week, the Grand Lodge of Canada, A. F. & A. M., will be held in Owen Sound. The visit of this large and influential body to Grey county is largely due to Judge Macpherson who is an enthusiastic craftsman and stands high in the esteem of his brethren. An earnest endeavor was made to get the next session of the Grand Lodge held in Ottawa, but Judge Macpherson ably combatted the proposition and Owen Sound was selected by a very large majority.

EXCHANGE CLIPPINGS.
Mary Jane Bailey, the eight-year-old daughter of Mr. Wm. Bailey, of Holland, had the misfortune to fall off the top of a fence last Monday and break her arm just above the wrist.—Chatsworth News.

A very sudden death is reported from Galt. Mr. E. Edwards, a young married man, who is a locksmith by trade, was engaged writing letters when his wife retired Friday night last. She took no notice to this as he was Secretary of Court Grand Valley, A. O. F., and often sat up late writing. When he did not come to bed after waiting till a late hour his wife got up to see what was the matter. She found him sitting in the chair just as he was when she left, but cold in death. Heart disease is supposed to be the cause.—Mt. Forest Rep.

The healthiest of all booms seems to have struck the town in the line of the advent of manufactures. No sooner was it an established fact that the Polson Shipyard was to be established here than the Ontario Lumber Company must make this their headquarters and the Canadian Pacific Railway Company put up another elevator as big as the first one; and now the Cobourg Car Works thinks this is the place, too, and they have level heads. All right; Mr. James Crossen is just the kind of a man to appreciate Owen Sound, and ample accommodation can be provided for him. This is the kind of a boom that means business.—O. S. Advertiser.

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS NOTES.

The Grand Trunk's Extensions.
Mr. Hickson, general manager of the Grand Trunk railway, is credited with having said that the recent acquisition of the Toledo, Saginaw & Muskegon line is of great importance to the Grand Trunk. The line extends from Asheo to Muskegon, in Michigan. The proposed Sault Ste. Marie line, when built, will probably connect with the Northern division at Burke's Falls, and his company will fairly divide the Manitoba trade with the Canadian Pacific.

Thunder Storm.
STRATFORD, Aug. 8.—A serious thunder storm passed over here this afternoon. During its progress Thos. Rice, butcher, of this city, who resides with his brother near the Little Lakes was struck by lightning and instantly killed, while standing in his doorway of his barn.

EXETER, Ont., Aug. 8.—The heaviest thunder storm of the season passed over this place this afternoon. Lightning struck the drying kiln of Dyer & Howard's planing mills, setting fire to the framework. Inside the kiln, luckily, it was built of brick and the fire was extinguished without doing much damage.

Owen Sound Carries the By-law.
OWEN SOUND, Aug. 8.—The by-law to grant \$15,000 to the C. P. Railway Company as a bonus towards the erection of a new elevator and the excavation of a slip, was carried to-day by a

vote of 387 to 19. To carry the by-law it was necessary to have two-thirds of the total vote polled, which was done but such a lively interest was taken in the matter that 118 votes more than that number were polled. The election for and ship are the principal items contemplated by the C. P. R. Co. it is also intended to erect lumber wharves and freight warehouses, which will probably involve a total expenditure of \$300,000.

Sentenced at Owen Sound.
OWEN SOUND, July 30.—(In Toronto) day last Mr. Jas. Long, of Sydenham, went away from home, leaving his hired man, named W. Smith, in charge and gave him the key of the house. On Mr. Long's return in the evening he found his man had gone, and that he had busied himself in going through places more interesting than the paupers. On going to his room Mr. Long found that his private bureau had been opened and a gold watch worth \$150 and \$39 in cash besides had been abstracted. After some search Smith was found asleep in Meaford hotel with the watch and \$39 of the money under his pillow. He was taken to Owen Sound, where Police Magistrate Spencer sentenced him to eighteen months in the Carleton Prison.

Editor Standard:
SIR,—In reference to the pedigree of Lord Derby which Mr. Beattie in his challenge, declares improper, I wish the public to see clearly how the matter now stands. It will be remembered Mr. Beattie inserted in your paper a few weeks ago a challenge or offer to put up one hundred dollars to find that Lord Derby was not properly registered. These presumptions interfered in my business in this particular line meant something that I could not silently overlook and I placed five dollars in the hand of W. L. Young leaving the decision to be taken from the books of the Clydesdale association through the secretary, Mr. Henry Wade, Toronto, who is known to be the highest authority on the subject. Mr. Young wrote Mr. Wade and in fairness to myself, Mr. Beattie and interested, has placed the letter of Mr. Wade for publication which here give:

TORONTO, July 31st, 1888.
Mr. W. L. Young, Markdale, Ont.
DEAR SIR,—Yours of 30th received. The enclosed pedigree of Lord Derby (imp.) [37], 1067, [1742] is duly recorded; first in Scotch Clydesdale Book as No. [1742]; second in American Clydesdale Book as 1067, and third in Canadian Clydesdale Book as [37]. He is properly registered in three of the books, as given under stamp on May 15th, 1886.

And further, as Mr. Beattie has gone so far as to insinuate in his late edition to Mr. Pickell in your paper, and also to others that Lord Derby is not Lord Derby at all but a fraud, I give the public the declaration of Mr. Jackson who imported Lord Derby as obtained by Mr. Pickell a short time ago. It reads as follows:

West Toronto Junction, July 13, 1888.
Mr. W. G. Pickell:
DEAR SIR,—I hereby certify that the horse, Lord Derby, sold by me to Trimble & Pickell, of Markdale, and now owned by Thorpe Wright, of Flesherton, is the horse imported by me as Lord Derby and recorded as [1742] in Scotch book, 1067 American book and [37] in Canadian book, and that he is the only Lord Derby that is registered under these numbers.

Now, sir, the above evidence is conclusive to any reasonable man and I claim the money. But wishing to give Mr. Beattie every satisfaction I mean to make it so satisfactory to him that he will not lightly interfere with other men's horses again. I will even accede to his second proposition, absurd and meaningless as it is in this way. He can take his particular friend, J. I. Graham, and I will take Mr. Wm. Rennie, an extensive importer of horses, and let them meet in the office of Mr. Wade, Toronto, where all necessary books are to be had for information relative to imported horses, and let them there decide the matter, but under no consideration will I allow Lord Derby's reputation to be interfered with by books furnished by Beattie, Graham & Co.
