Finding a Break in a Cable.

The location of a break in an ocean cable is very accurately determined by a process known to electricians, and by an instrument | 15. 50 Front Street E., Toronto, Canada. which discloses how far an electrical current started on a given line of wire travels before it meets with interruption. The calculation of the distance of the break made on this side of the Atlantic can be checked and confirmed by a similar calculation made on the other side, although such a confirmation is scarcely necessary. After having found out how far from land the break is, the only other thing the captain or navigator of the cable steamer wants to know is, in what direction that distance is to be travelled and as the course of the cable is perfectly well known, from the fact that when the cable was laid accurate observations were taken by the cable layers and records made, the cable steamer starting out to do the work can steam directly over






