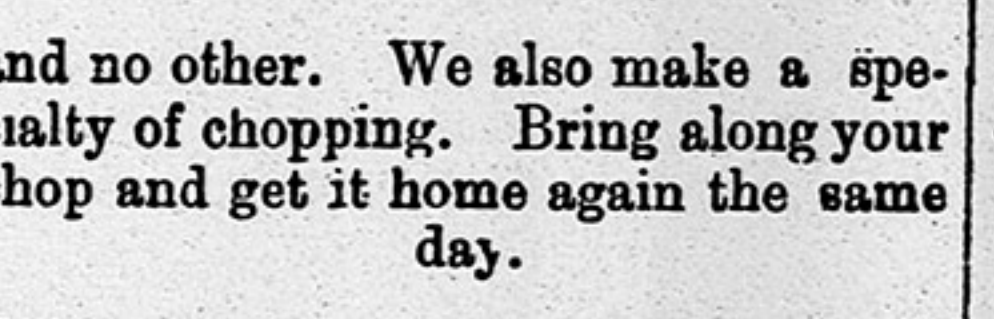

Holland council met on above date at McCutcheon's hall for the transaction of business. Reeves in the chair; members all present. Minutes of meeting of Nov. 15 read, approved and signed.
Robert Gillies applied for to have taxes of 1886 on lot N^o 54 1, Wilmamsford, refunded. No action taken.
Galbraith—Hampton—That James Fraser be refunded \$1 as over-charge in taxes for road work for the year 1889.—Carried.
Foster—Shute—That we refund E. H. Meelands \$1.69 as over-paid taxes for the year 1887, as per Auditors supplementary report.—Carried.
Accounts were presented from A. McGill & Son, road scraper, \$9; Jno. Rutherford, stationary 1887 and 1889, \$7.95; Dr. J. B. McCullough, attendance on Mrs. Graham and Mr. McNevin.
Hampton—Shute—That the bill of A. McGill, for road scraper, amounting to \$9, be paid.—Carried.
Galbraith—Hampton—That we pay Dr. McCullough \$8 for medical attendance on Mrs. Graham, and the bill for attending Mr. McNevin be laid over for further consideration as we do not consider we have any right to pay it.—Carried.
Shute—Hampton—That we pay Mr. James Page \$4 for covering culvert on the 2nd con. of Holland.—Carried.
Galbraith—Hampton—That By-law No. 7 be read a first time.—Carried.
Hampton—Foster—That By-law No. 7, establishing road deviations, be read a 2nd and 3rd times, signed, sealed and engrossed in the By-law book.—Carried.
Hampton—Shute—That Mr. Robt. Gillies get an order for \$102.50, being the amount of Arbitrator's award on deviation on lot 64, con. 8.—Carried.
Galbraith—Foster—That Wm. Delaine get an order for \$1 as statute labor taxes overpaid in error.—Carried.
Hampton—Shute—That the Clerk be instructed to register the deed of deviation on lot 64, con. 8, Holland.—Carried.
Shute—Hampton—That William Davidson get an order for \$2, an overcharge on taxes for the year 1889.—Carried.
Galbraith—Hampton—That James Wright get an order for \$6.60 as taxes overpaid on lot pt. 61, con. 1, W. T. & S. R., for the year 1889.—Carried.

Foster—Galbraith—That By-law No. 8 be read a 2nd and 3rd time, signed, sealed and engrossed in the By-law book.—Carried.
Shute—Foster—That there be an order granted Mr. Hare for \$80, balance of salary for 1889.—Carried.
Galbraith—Hampton—That the Treasurer get an order for \$80 as salary for 1889.—Carried.
Hampton—Shute—That this council grant an order to the Trustees of S. S. 10 to the amount of \$9.42, paid in error to other sections in 1887.—Carried.
Foster—Hampton—That J. Galbraith be authorized to let and erect a bridge on No. 8 side road, con. 1, and that it be completed by July 1st, 1890.—Carried.
Galbraith—Foster—That this council grant an order to Trustees of U. S. S. 1, Holland & Sydenham, of \$20.42 paid in error.—Carried.
Galbraith—Hampton—That the Treasurer get an order for \$2 for postage and stationery.—Carried.
Galbraith—Foster—That William Hampton get an order for \$4.40 for commission on special grants.—Carried.
Hampton—Foster—That this council grant an extension of time to the Collector to the 15th day of January, and that the Clerk notify his sureties to that effect.—Carried.
Hampton—Shute—That this council adjourn sine die.—Carried.

The council met December 16th pursuant to statute. All the members present; the Reeve in the chair. Minutes of last meeting read and confirmed.
Communications and reports read as follows:—From Local Board of Health, the annual report of same; from Wm. R. Rumbough, an account for survey; from Wm. McDonald and John Simpson, a certificate as to completion of a water-course; from Board of School Trustees, Markdale, an order to pay school money; from J. T. Wilson, an account for work on low-line G. and A.; from Peter Watson, a petition for refund of statute labor tax.
Commissioner for ward 4 was authorized to make provision for clearing new road at lot 27, con. 3, E. G. R., as soon as the Reeve makes final provision for exchange of old road.
The Reeve reported assignments for a deviation on lot 15, con. 3, E. G. R., and the Clerk was instructed to send the same with others to Crown Lands Department for registration and to obtain patents.
Fanny Smith, Mary Wilkie, Mary Flynn and Widow Cameron were exempted from payment of township taxes for current year.
Instructions were issued to erase statute labor tax charged on Collector's roll against lots 14 and 15, con. 4, S. D. R., labor having been performed in 1888, but not returned by pathmaster.
Communication from J. T. Wilson was ordered to be laid over for further information.
The Reeve was instructed to arrange with council of Markdale relative to N. R. lots, assessed in error in 1887.
The statute labor charged on roll against Bernard and Edward Hartford was ordered to be struck off, the same having since been performed and certified to by pathmaster.
Cheques were issued as follows, viz: Members of Local Board of Health \$4 each, \$20.00; the several School Section Trustees, for rates, \$3,362.07; Wm. Fallice, 4 cords of wood for hall, \$4.00; Joseph Payne, work at lot 20, con. 11, \$8.00; Thomas Wright, work at lot 20, con. 11, \$24.00; John H. Hayes, work at lot 20, con. 11, \$4.50; Wm. White, work at lot 20, con. 11, \$20.00; Rowell & Hutchison, order book and voter's list, \$7.63; Wm. B. Rumbough, P. L. S., for surveying and plans, \$11.00; Wm. Jackson, one new road scraper, \$9.00; Wm. McDonald, for drain as per engineer's award, \$2.00; J. S. Black, postage, oil and express charges, \$1.74; J. S. Black, furnishing council proceedings for publication, \$10.00; Jno. Gallagher, extra work at lot 15, con. 12, in 1888, \$2.00; Wm. H. Arrowsmith, for payment for legal advice, \$2.00; E. Kilmer, four lamps for hall, \$4.00; Thos. Lauder, registration fees and search, \$4.55; John Morrison, grading at lot 15, con. 4, N. D. R., \$2.00; Archibald Campbell, for right of way, lot 15, con. 8, E. G. R., \$15.00; Andrew Ritchie, balance on gravelling on Lambton st., \$2.25; G. Hayes, repairing road scraper, 25 cents; P. Neil, letting and inspecting, \$5.00; A. C. Beaton, letting and inspecting, \$2.00; Chas. Moffat, 3 days on committee, \$6.00; Mrs. Chas. Boyle, Jowar for deviation, lot 5, con. 13, \$1.00; Jas. Edge, extra services as treasurer, \$5.00.
The Reeve having left the chair, the same was taken by Mr. Williams, when it was moved by Mr. McMillan and seconded by Mr. Williams, that the thanks of this council are due and are hereby tendered to Chas. Moffat, Esq., Reeve, for the able and impartial manner in which he has presided over this council during the year now coming to a close. Carried unanimously.
