SOUTHERN MANITOBA
ITS ADVANTAGES FOR SETTLEMENT SET FORTH IN ONTARIO.

Mr. G. L. Dodds, of Melita, one of the successful merchants of Manitoba, is in the city on his way to do migration work on behalf of this province. Mr. Dodds is one of those who believe that the grand heritage of Manitoba properly belongs to Canadians and not to foreigners, and with this idea uppermost in his mind he will devote a month to the task of setting before the agriculturists of Ontario the advantages offered by the province to settlers. Mr. Dodds endeavored strenuously to persuade the municipality of Melita to send an agent east, but, failing in this, he made a proposition to the C. P. R. and the Northwest Land Company which corporations did not hesitate to commission him as their agent. His labors will chiefly be confined to the district north of Toronto, along the Toronto, Grey and Bruce division of the C. P. R., a district with which he is thoroughly acquainted, having spent the greater portion of his life in it. Mr. Dodds, while advertising the advantages of Manitoba generally, will particularly direct attention to the Southern part of the Province, and from the fact that he himself has large interests there, as well as having the welfare of this land of illimitable possibilities at heart, good results may be expected by Southern Manitoba from his mission. — [Winnipeg Daily Free Press.

The Coulson House Tragedy.
On Monday morning about 4 o'clock as a young man named Geo. Jackson, who acts as call boy for the C. P. R. was passing the Coulson House on Union street, he found a man lying on the sidewalk. As the man was lying beside the building he came to the conclusion that he was intoxicated, and after some little effort to arouse him he went on his way. After a while he returned and found the man then lying across the sidewalk, and still failed to arouse him. On his way to the station he met P. C. Shouldice and told him of the occurrence, and the officer went to investigate. The man was taken into the Coulson House and was found to be one of the boarders there, named Wm. Henry Joll. As he remained in an unconscious condition medical aid was summoned, and the doctors pronounced him seriously injured. It appears that Joll occupied a room in the 3rd story of the building, and had jumped from the window or fallen from it to the sidewalk. The mysterious part of the matter is how did he get out and leave the window closed? and why did he jump out any way? At all events the poor fellow sustained injuries so severe that he died Tuesday morning. An inquest has been opened, but adjourned till Thursday night to give time for post mortem examination and report. The unfortunate man was about 36 years of age, a good character, and steady habits, as far as we can learn. He came to this country from England about 19 years ago. He had an uncle Mr. Chas. Batten, of Collingwood, who has taken charge of the body, and also an uncle, Mr. Wm. Batten in Orono, Ont. The remains will be interred in Owen Sound.—Advertiser.
