Municipal Council of the Village of Mar-
kdale, held the 30th day of April A. D.
1890.

Members all present; the Reeve in
the chair.
Minutes of last meeting read, and
confirmed.

Communications—John Whitty,
account for assessing; John Casar,
lamp glasses; School Trustees, pine
lumber; C. W. Rutledge, printing.
Brown—Haskett—That the Reeve
be requested to have the pine plank
for sidewalks put into the stove factory
for safe keeping.—Carried.

Lyons—Plewes—That the following
accounts be paid, viz: John Whitty,
for assessing and postage, 1890. \$20.
10; John Casar, lamp glasses for
street lamp at station, 50 cents;
School Trustees for pine plank 7,500
feet and freight on same, \$94.50 and C.
W. Rutledge, for printing, advertising
and stationery, \$11.65.—Carried.

Plewes—Haskett—That Mr. Brown
be instructed to make necessary pre-
parations of Council Chamber for
Division Court.—Carried.

Lyons—Haskett—That the Clerk
be instructed to write to Mr. J. S.
Black, township clerk of Glenelg, en-
quiring how much he would charge for
preparing a correct map of this village.
—Carried.

Brown—Lyons—That this corpora-
tion purchase the grounds of the
Glenelg Agricultural Society situated
in Markdale for the sum of \$500, said
grounds containing five acres.—lost.

The yeas and nays being called
were as follows: Yeas—Wm. Brown
and John Lyons. Nays—W. J.
McFarland, G. M. Haskett and Angus
Plewes.

The committee appointed last meet-
ing on Drainage reported verbally to
the effect that after having examined
the locality which required draining
and decided to open a drain, that the
owners of the property through whose
land the drain would pass refused to
allow such drain to be opened through
their property.

Lyons—Haskett—That the Reeve
and Mr. Brown, as soon as practicable,
wait on the parties through whose
property the contemplated drain is
intended to run, ascertain what they
intend doing in the premises, and re-
port at next meeting of council.—
Carried.

The Clerk was instructed to com-
municate with the County Judge and
ascertain whether the Voters' List of
1889 as printed and certified to is
legal for the coming Provincial Elec-
tions, and if not, what course is
necessary to make it legal.

The council met pursuant to ad-
journalment on 26th April, 1890.
Member all present; minutes of last
session of council read and approved.
By-law No. 493, confirming the
appointment of pathmasters, pound-
keepers and fenceviewers carried
through the different stages and passed.
The Reeve, Mr. Paterson and the
Assessor were appointed to attend the
next meeting of the Holland council
re mistake made by the assessor of
Holland regarding the number of
acres in Union S. S. No. 2 for 1888.

Mr. Paterson was instructed to meet
the Reeve of St. Vincent in reference
to getting repairs made on the Town
Line. Mr. Paterson was also instruct-
ed to get a culvert built on Walter's
Falls road opposite lot 30, con. 10.
The Reeve's orders were issued on
the Treasurer to pay as follows, viz:
Richard Lee, \$1.00, repairing bridge;
Thomas Gilray, Reeve, \$15.00, said
amount to be expended by him in the
purchase of tickets and paying other
expenses in sending John Mathews
and wife (who are old and indigent)
to relatives at Huntsville, John
Davis, \$5.00, building culvert; James
Camplin, \$2.00, ditching on valley
road; John Clugston, \$6.50, building
culvert; William Stuart, \$3.00, to
pay men for building culvert; Charles
G. Deyitt, \$80.00, salary as assessor
for current year; Robert Armstrong,
\$8.00, repairing bridge; Robert
Dunlop, clerk, \$20.00, transcribing
and preparing minutes for printing;
W. P. Carson, \$10.00, indigent relief;
William Stuart, Esq., \$5.00 being re-
fund of amount advanced by him for
relief of John Mathews and wife who
are old and indigent.
